## Callington Heritage Centre

Firstly, many thanks to the Lions Club of Callington for their donation of £100 to the Heritage Centre. This sum will be put towards the cost of purchasing items for the wonderful scale model of Callington Station now on display.

Talking of the Station, since our last entry in the Newsletter, we have managed to purchase an A3 size colour photograph. This was taken from roughly the position once occupied by Rundle's Grocers and Butchers shop, looking at the whole of the station and into Station Road (formerly called Tavistock Road). The rear end of a single decker green Western National bus is also shown. This is the station as we remember it, taken we think between 1964 and 1966. On the Notice Boards is advertised "A London Day Out" for 12/6d. Good value I would say!

I have also distributed around the Town a few copies of "100 Faces / Stories" a collaboration between the Cornwall Museums Group and others. A quite impressive First World War collection based on Cornish characters, some famous some not, with a cameo description of each of their lives during that period, it even includes some animal stories. The one I liked was of the two Shire Horses taken by their keepers and hidden in a cave on a beach to avoid them being taken for service to the war effort.

Callington's contribution was the Callington born suffragette and pacifist Selina Cooper, to find out more about this formidable lady and to pick up a copy, pay us a visit. Volunteering at the Heritage Centre is never dull, this was again illustrated by an enquiry from a local Publican, the accuracy of his Pub sign having been called into question! This precipitated a whole new line of enquiry into what was the true colour uniform as worn by "The Rifle Volunteers" (clue there). They were actually raised locally and each town had their own version, which made finding a definitive answer extremely difficult. You will find us in Liskeard Road in The Old Chapel opposite Travis Perkins every Friday 10.00am – 4.00pm and the first Saturday of each month, same hours.

## CALLINGTON U3A

The speaker at the May meeting was Peter Lavis who talked about the Lost Gardeners of Heligan, a social history project of WW1. Peter told us all about the history of Heligan, he started his research eight years ago into what happened to the gardeners. He has found information on 16 men, 10 of which featured in his talk.

The first, Charles Dyer, was a fisherman from Mevagissey who was in the Naval Reserves. Called into action by the Town Crier ringing his bell, he was one of 48 men called up from there. In 1915 fishing trawlers were requisitioned for light gun and mine sweeping duties. Dyer was on one of these named the Rosa when he was injured and hospitalised in Plymouth. He disappeared from hospital and was classed as a deserter until his body was found two years later not far from his home. Presumably he had been trying to get back to see his family again.

Leonard Warne joined the Royal Engineers. In 1918 he was wounded in France, sent back to Plymouth Hospital where he died from his injuries. Albert Henry Rowe joined the Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry (DCLI) and died in 1918 aged 18. Records state he had enlisted and died on the same day! Investigations by Peter found that having enlisted and collected his uniform he was sent for training to Ireland where he died from flu. Charles Ball, a labourer, enlisted with the Worcestershire Regiment in 1916, was badly injured on the Somme in 1918 and died in hospital in France.

William Guy, a brilliant gardener, joined the DCLI in 1914, sent home suffering from shell shock, then went out again. He died at the Somme in 1918 when his whole battalion was wiped out without trace. Percy Carhart, a mere 5' 3½" tall, died without trace in 1917 at Passchendale.

Archibald Smaldon, a carpenter, served with several battalions during the war, probably because of his carpentry skills. He returned after the war to add an additional five children to the five he already had. The Paynters, father William and his sons Richard and Fred, all came back to work again at Heligan.

Memorials of those who died during the war were available to widows in the form of the Death Plaque, or Widow's Penny as it became popularly known. However, these had to be applied for and were not given out automatically.

Sir Edwin Lutyens and Gertrude Jekyll became involved in the design of the Commonwealth War Graves Commission cemeteries which can be seen across France and Belgium. They tried to personalise them and make them beautiful, peaceful places to visit. The names of men whose bodies were never found are engraved on panels surrounding the gravestones. The names of these gardeners from Heligan can be found on war memorials at their home towns and abroad. In 1990 restoration work started on the vegetable garden at Heligan as a tribute to its Lost Gardeners.

After Peter finished, Jane Black gave a vote of thanks for his interesting and thought provoking talk, one that would give an added dimension to any future visits to Heligan.

Healthy Weight Adults - is our 12-week weight management programme. You will find this programme suitable if you are above a healthy weight and aged over 18 years old. We run these all over Cornwall, in the morning, afternoon or evenings to fit in with your lifestyle.



Cllr Smith joined the Town Council in 2013 and is currently the Chair of Finance & General Purposes and a lead on the Neighbourhood Plan.

**News from the Town Council continued .....**

Momentarily the Town Council has registered an interest in the initiative purely to 'dip our toe' into the arena for devolving the service but made it clear that further information is needed before a final decision is made by the Town Council. Until then, we want to hear from YOU whether you want the Library and One Stop Shop to be taken over by the Town Council? If this were to happen you wouldn't receive a reduction in your Council Tax bill from Cornwall Council but a further increase in the precept set by the Town Council. Are you happy to pay extra to us in order to retain such a service in the Town?

Whether the future of the Library and One Stop Shop is in serious jeopardy of closure has yet to be confirmed with Cornwall Council but ultimately things are going to change because of the financial pressures imposed by Government. This could see reduced opening hours, less face to face contact with staff and more signposting to just phone numbers and email contacts. So let us know what you think about the longevity of the Library and One Stop Shop service, and whether the convenience of having someone in the Town that can help you with Cornwall Council services and retaining a library is worth those extra pounds on your Council Tax bill.


