

Callington Heritage Centre

As we are now in the month of November and the Heritage Centre closed until the Spring of 2017, it gives me an opportunity to turn my attention to other matters which are apposite. The photo which accompanies this piece is of some of the key members of Kelly Bray WI back in its heyday. As an institution the WI has served the community for just over 100 years and Kelly Bray in particular since 1937 or thereabouts, when their Hall was built. So it is with particular regret to hear that this serviceable community hub is now locked and rumour has it that it has been sold, denying villagers that which has been the stuff of this small community for very nearly 80 years. The loss of a facility because insufficient interested parties could not be found for its continuance as a WI. Its future usage could not be resolved, a better example of intransigence it would be hard to find. What has this got to do with the Heritage Centre I hear you say? Well quite a lot actually, as I bang on often enough in this column about preserving our history and infrastructure, what better or worse example could you get than this? So we must resolve to use our precious opportunities. Where clubs exist, support them. Where there are functioning community bodies, likewise. Same old "Use it or lose it", we have the capacity to bring about so many favourable outcomes to ensure our Town remains a vibrant and interesting place to live. But it needs your support. This photo is one of my late mother's collection and shows members of Kelly Bray WI on the occasion of a visit from the WI Secretary. I think this must have taken place in the 1970s but might have been earlier. People will recognise Mrs P Brown, Mary Tancock, W Cansfield, Phyllis Lazenbury and others whose names shamefully I cannot remember.



CALLINGTON U3A

The speaker this month for the Callington U3A was Dr David Price a retired psychiatrist. He gave us a very interesting talk on the wildlife of the Tamar Valley.

When walking his dogs, he always took a camera, he was very soon caught up in the beautiful wildlife of the Tamar Valley. Following the river Tamar (the name is said to mean Great Water, or the prehistoric river word meaning Dark Flowing). He follows it from Endsleigh down to Milton Abbot through Horsebridge, Lockett, Latchley, to Gunnislake, Morwellham, Cotehele and Calstock. Dr Price has taken some beautiful photographs of this stretch of the valley with different habitats throughout the seasons. Pictures of glowing sunlight, gleaming frost, kingfishers, insects and butterflies, all in different states of fluttering, mating, feeding, and sunbathing. Wild flowers were also a theme with lovely pictures of rare beauties including Columbine, Purple Toothwort, Birds Nest Orchids, Eyebright, also fungi like Dryads Saddle, Fly Agaric and Stink Horn.

The butterflies Dr Price had photographed were remarkable, Red Admirals, Comma, Brimstone, Heath Fritillaries, Silver Wash Fritillaries, Marbled White and lots more. With fascinating facts about hoverflies, wasps, hornets, dragon flies, and other insects, some apparently have three small eyes on the top of their heads that detect light which help them to pitch and roll, the aeronautical industry are looking at this for the use in drones etc. He also talked about the mining 'Finger Posts' along his route, saying that, some say, that Launceston became 'Lanson' because they could not fit the full name on the posts. Birds were also a feature, including the habitats of a charm Goldfinches, Goldcrests, Fieldfares, Redwings also Nightjars and Sand Martins, that nest in the mining spoils at Devon Great Consul but being arsenic laden, it does kill some birds. He took a great picture of the reflection of a Goldcrest in his kitchen window. His talk was an A-Z of wildlife but we only got half way through, we are hoping he can return to finish the alphabet. Dr Price takes about 10,000 pictures a year, he shows us that if you take the time and look closer at nature, just what there is to see.



Things have moved on with the Murals Project since the inaugural meeting and we are delighted to have been contacted by two local residents who have had experience in other community murals projects elsewhere in the UK.



Minar Pasión

Minar Pasión derives from the shared history of mining, employing Flamenco dance, traditional Cornish Scoot dance, live Flamenco music, commissioned poetry, narration and visual art.

Hardship, Hope and New Horizons - the Cornish and Spanish Diaspora retold in a new multi-media performance by international dance and theatre company: *Claudia Caolín Y Compañía*.

This latest piece explores the connection between Flamenco and mining, drawing historical parallels between Cornish dance, Flamenco dance and the tradition of passionate song inspired by working in the Andalusian mines.

The show draws on the wealth of music, dance and imagery inspired by the experiences of mining communities of both **Southern Spain** and **Cornwall**.

Flamenco owes much of its origins to those working in the metal and mining industries, with one particular style, the **Taranto**, being solely born out of the mining experience.

Just as **Cornish Tin** has been a ticket to foreign lands and new horizons, the **Spanish Diaspora** enhanced Flamenco song and dance through its contact with mining colonies overseas, incorporating the cultural flavour of Latin-America.

Thousands left, thousands returned - each telling their own, moving individual story.

A theatrical evening awaits which aims to capture the pathos, drama, colour and excitement inherent within the experience of life-risking and life-changing exodus.
