



Cornwall Resources Ltd

2017 Exploration Programme



As most residents of Kelly Bray and Callington will know, Cornwall Resources Ltd have been carrying out exploratory drilling in Kelly Bray since March this year. The two-rig diamond drilling programme was aimed at expanding and upgrading the existing high-grade resource.

Fourteen out of the fifteen holes have been completed so far in the Phase 1 programme, assay results are currently available for the first ten holes.

Phase 2, an additional three to six holes, recently started and is expected to be completed in October with results by the end of the year.

There are now two local community members working for the drilling company and CRL has employed a local Geologist and a local Mining Engineer. CRL's Community Advisor is also locally based. CRL has also entered into collaboration arrangements with local and regional universities; Master's student research projects have been set up with the Camborne School of Mines and the University of Portsmouth. Another project is in the planning stage with Plymouth University. A recent Master's graduate who lives in Kelly Bray has been provided with an informal internship during August.

Dog Fouling Penalty set to rise



In October 2017 the existing Dog Control Order (DCO) of the fouling of land by dogs will automatically convert to a Public Space Protection Order (PSPO). The DCO covering the beaches has already been converted over following a public consultation. PSPOs are made under The Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014. Once these have been converted the cost of a fixed penalty notice will rise to £100 and there will no longer be the option of a lesser amount if paid within fourteen days.

Failure to pay the Fixed Penalty Notice will result in Cornwall Council referring the case to court for the original offence which can result in a fine of up to £1,000.

Action on Hearing Loss

Vital hearing loss information & support in Callington, Cornwall

Since launching its free 'Hear to Inform and Support' service in March this year, the charity Action on Hearing Loss are keen to expand the project across Cornwall. The five year project, funded by the Big Lottery, aims to deliver vital information and support for those with hearing loss in Cornwall and help reduce isolation.

The project will be delivered through a series of regular drop-in sessions at 'hub' venues in rural towns and villages for local residents to get support and guidance about any aspect of their hearing loss, from specialist equipment to hearing aid maintenance. Run by Action on Hearing Loss staff as well as trained and supported volunteers, those who may be concerned about their hearing will have the opportunity to have their hearing screened to see whether they would benefit from visiting their GP and being referred to an audiologist. The service is now at Callington and being delivered every 3rd Thursday of the month from 10.00am to 1.00pm at Callington Town Hall. Jason Sculthorpe, Project Coordinator at Action on Hearing Loss said:

"We're delighted to be expanding our information services in Callington, where approximately one in five people are living with hearing loss. "Through working with other local organisations and opening hubs such as the ones in Callington we'll be able to reach and support more people with hearing loss than ever before, particularly in rural communities."

Well the Carnival is well and truly over, another season done. After much hard work from our volunteers and some improvisation, we managed the "Carnival" theme very well and it was equally well received, by our public, judging by the comments in the Visitors Book. Ideas and suggestions for next years main theme have already been discussed, no decisions yet though. The imminent arrival of the new IT installation, has prompted a re-examination of our floor space with various suggestions as to how things might be improved, by moving the furniture so to speak. Our options are indeed limited, however, we may manage to "tweak" a few items to deliver up more space. Either way, I am rather fond of the current set up and whilst some may say it is too informal, I firmly believe in the personal touch and the last thing most people want is to wander around with a deferential reverence, in an awkward silence, a la Libraries of old ! Quite a few visitors last month, not least 27 or so from the local Branch of The Old Cornwall Society who enjoyed the red carpet treatment. We in turn visited and were well received by Stoke Climsland Old School on their "Archive Day", who would have known that a "Spencer Churchill" was involved in setting up the old place and that classrooms were tiered upwards towards the back, so that Teachers could easily see those hiding! Oh! and a couple of weeks ago a gentleman walked in enquiring if we had a photograph of the Steam Locomotive "Callington", it transpired that when he was a boy living in London, he and his mates used to go trainspotting at Waterloo Station. It turned out that the "Callington" was the first train on which he was invited up on to the ootplate by the Driver or Fireman, as they sometimes did in those days, if you were lucky. Anyway, we duly obliged and found a beauty in B & W with the loco coming around a bend at full steam pulling seven or eight carriages, this dated from the early 60s, he was delighted. The "Callington" did not run on our local Branch Line - it was far too big. Since my last bulletin, Sheila Lightbody has passed away, I only knew her from her involvement with the little Antique Shop run by her husband in Saltash Road and my ownership (a present from my Mum) of "The Book of Callington" – the "go to" reference book of the town and its history. Not a bad legacy for that alone, although she took an active part in much more.

Mark Tambllyn who had lately come to the Heritage Centre and was beginning to make an impact, (remember the book of "Callington South Australia") has moved up to the Lincolnshire/Nottingham border to a town not dissimilar to our own. The Tambllyns have been an integral part of S.E. Cornwall for generations, we wish them well. 
