




Countdown to MayFest!





Don't Lose Your Way

For all the avid ramblers in our Parish, and everyone who enjoys exploring the winding ways and woodland paths in and around Callington and Kelly Bray, here is an important date to add to your diaries.

On January 1st 2026, the 'definitive map', which is the official map of public rights of way, is due to be closed to claims for unrecorded historic paths. This primarily affects paths which were established before 1949 and have yet to be recorded.

Any of these pre-1949 paths that have not been recorded before the cut-off will be formally extinguished. This means they will no longer be protected from obstruction, closure, or being built upon.

Which Routes Will Be Affected? - While the deadline is intended only to impact historic rights of way, it is wise to claim any unrecorded paths sooner rather than later. This makes it far easier to protect these paths from building works and other impediments.

At present, if a route has been openly used for 20 years without interruption, it can be claimed under section 31 of the Highways Act. However, as of January 1st 2026, it may not be possible to submit a claim until a further 20 years have passed. This would mean your right of way could not be protected until 2046, during which time it could be permanently closed or obstructed.

Why Are Some Rights of Way Not On the Map? - If a right of way is created by a legal agreement or order, then it is added to the definitive map as a matter of course. However, rights of way can also be established as the result of being routinely used by the public over a period of time. Paths used for under 20 years may still be claimed by common law. However, the shorter the period of use, the more intensive that use must be for the case to be accepted. The requirements are as follows.

- The path must have been openly used by the general public. This means that if the landowner chose to observe the path, it would be obvious that it was being publicly used.
- No efforts were made to prevent the right of way coming into existence. Notices denoting land as private, or physically preventing access can be seen as attempts to demonstrate that there was no intention to dedicate the land as a public right of way.
- The usage must include the general public, not just an isolated group, such as farm workers travelling to work on a particular estate.

To claim a path by common law there needs to be someone with the legal capacity to dedicate the path as a right of way. This will usually be the freeholder of the land. This does not need to be the person who makes the claim. However, if the freeholder is willing to support the claim, it can significantly speed up the process of adding a right of way to the map.

How To Claim a Right of Way - The first step is to check whether the path has already been claimed, by contacting the local surveying authority. For us, this is Cornwall Council. You can also look at Cornwall Council's interactive map at: <https://map.cornwall.gov.uk/website/ccmap>

You will need to click on the icon in the top left, marked "Layers", then select "Leisure" and "Public Rights of Way". This will then display recorded rights of way on the map. If a path has not been recorded, you will need to gather evidence of its use over 20 consecutive years or more, leading up to the date of the claim. You should try to gather at least six witnesses who have used the path during this period, to support your claim. It is also possible to collate historic evidence to support your claim. For more detailed information on collecting evidence, as well as reporting issues with existing paths, www.ramblers.org.uk is a fantastic resource.

Better Safe Than Sorry - Keep in mind that if any part of a right of way is unrecorded, that part could be obstructed, effectively terminating that route. So don't assume that a path is safe just because the majority of it is on the map. Some unprotected routes can be surprising, including green lanes, tarmacked roads, and even urban alleyways. If in doubt, it's wise to check that your path has been recorded, or you could lose it forever. The Town Council is keen to see that our Parish rights of way are protected, so if you submit a claim for a path, or you need advice on doing so, please contact one of your local councillors to let them know. 2026 may seem a long way off, but as we all know, time flies, and it would be sad to see these long-standing thoroughfares be lost.


Callington Heritage Centre

Did you know that Cornwall represented Great Britain in the 1908 Olympic Rugby Final against Australia played at The White City Stadium? Four of Cornwall's players actually played for England. To get the full story make sure you come and visit. Find out about the Gunnislake boy who scored two goals for Everton at Wembley and won a Cup Final Medal. Spring has sprung at at Merryhue

At Merryhue Farm the first signs of spring are showing, and we are excited to announce the start of two new projects.

Creative Ageing aims to bring together a group of people from the local community who have an interest in exploring all types of creative arts. It is targeted at the older population, age 65+, and particularly those who suffer from social isolation in our rural community. It is known that taking part in creative activities promotes positive mental health, as does social contact, so by bringing the two together in one project we aim to stimulate conversation, thinking, imagination and friendship. You don't need to be "good" at art, simply have an interest in exploring your creativity through mediums such as felting, photography, drawing, collage, poetry – the list is endless!

Our first session is on May 4th, with subsequent sessions being run every other Friday, May 18th and June 1st.

Dementia Adventure is a project being run in partnership with Care Farming UK, to encourage those living with dementia to connect with nature. We know that exercise and mental stimulation can have a positive impact on people who have dementia, helping them to have a better quality of life and sustain their independence for longer. We are planning a series of sessions at Merryhue Farm for those living with dementia and their carers. While we have lots of ideas about activities such as walks around the farm, animal interaction, green craft, the choice of activity will be guided by the participants themselves.

The first session is on April 27th, with sessions being run fortnightly on a Friday, May 11th, May 25th and June 8th

All sessions for both groups are at 10.00am – 12.30pm and are free of charge. Tea and coffee is included. If you would like to know more about this, please contact us on 01579 384798 and ask for Nikki.
