

## NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

Callington Town Council have put out a 'call for land' as part of the emerging Callington & Kelly Bray Neighbourhood Plan following the appointment of new Consultants for the project.

The call has come following a meeting with Clifton Emery Design and LRM Planning. They have been employed by the Council to bring forward the Plan which will consider areas for new homes and employment spaces to meet future needs and identify the infrastructure and other improvements that will help the area over the next twenty years.

As part of this process they will be looking at areas that could be developed to meet the requirements of the Cornwall Local Plan, which was approved by the Government in November 2016 and targeted 1,000 homes for the Caradon Community Network centred around Callington.

"The Neighbourhood Plan is an opportunity for local people to help shape the future of the area and the community's views need to be at the heart of the project. The focus of the work to begin is understanding the important issues for local people and finding out how they would like Callington and Kelly Bray to develop over the coming years" said Helen Dowdall, Clerk to the Town Council who has set up a Steering Group for the Plan production.

She added, "in order to help us identify the best sites for future development we are calling on landowners in the area to submit details of any sites now that they might think would be suitable for housing, employment or community use in the future. This will give us the best possible selection to choose from to meet the requirements of the Local Plan."

Details of any sites need to be submitted using a form that is available from, the Town Council Office or on the Town Council's website <https://Callington-tc.gov.uk/Neighbourhood Plan/>. Closing date for the submissions is Friday 7th September 2018.

The steering group will be holding a consultation on Friday 27th and Saturday 28th July at Callington Town Hall to give the public an opportunity to further engage in the formation of the plan following the initial survey. The event will take place from 2.00pm to 6.00pm on Friday and 10.00am until 2.00pm on Saturday. Following the consultation there will be a week-long exhibition in the Town Hall from Monday 30<sup>th</sup> July.



# CALLINGTON U3A

## NOT SO YOUNG, BUT HAVING FUN

Many people have no idea what we do at U3A (University of the Third Age). Firstly, it is not a university and secondly "Third Age" covers anyone who is no longer in full time gainful employment. So, by definition, this is usually the more mature person.

There are now over 1,000 U3As in this country, they are self-run but overseen by National Office. Each U3A has a committee where the members serve a maximum of three years, so member involvement is encouraged. Members can join "groups" within their U3A. These groups range from Art to Philosophy and Allotment to Walking, with subjects such as Bridge, Crime Writing, Baking, Needlework, Quizzes, Pub Lunches and Table Tennis among the 31 subjects currently available. If your interest isn't catered for why not start your own group? Some groups meet weekly, some monthly and some twice a month. There are groups which meet in members' homes and groups which use hired premises where the rent is shared amongst the members of that group.

There is no study and no exams. The groups are there to encourage your interest, stimulate your mind (and body in some cases) and to have some fun. Also to meet new people, make new friends and maybe improve your social life. There is also a monthly meeting to which all members are invited to attend. These take place on the first Monday of each month in Callington Town Hall at 10.00am for tea/coffee and biscuits and a chat. Any business announcements are made first followed by a guest speaker. The meetings finish by 12 noon. If the first Monday falls on a bank holiday then the meeting will be on the following Monday.

The current annual membership fee is £12.50 per person, renewable after the AGM in April, half price if you join in or after October. Anyone interested can come along free to a Monday meeting to see what we do before committing to joining. For more info go to the website:



# Callington Heritage Centre

Well you may recall that in the last issue I referred to the Family History Day over at Liskeard. Kay and Elaine were our representatives and attended with many more coming from Museums around South East Cornwall. The event was visited by about 200 people, some locals and some from as far afield as Canada and Australia, so I think it was a success. On the home front, the Dr Trowbridge story lingers on with a phone call from Mrs Cox of Stoke Climsland who says that he attended her mother on her delivery, she did give a date, but being a gentleman.....! And more or less concurrently we were visited by a new family to Callington who have moved into the house in Church St where the goodly Doctor had his surgery and practiced, it's amazing how these things seem to snowball. They certainly did for me, as he attended when I broke my leg when aged 12, snow balling after falling off a hedge. I was wearing "Wellingtons" and my Mother was all for him cutting the boot off, but he wouldn't dream of it, ruining a perfectly good pair of boots! The screams could be heard in Callington! However, my leg was put in full plaster at Greenbank Hospital and after 6 months I was released, it must have been a success as I enjoyed many years of football thereafter. We have just taken possession of a well preserved Tri-Corn Hat, courtesy of our Town Council. Now this item is very old and woven with gold braid and clearly was, in it's day, quite a luxury, bearing a label "The Chancery, London". How long it has been in the Council's possession I doubt whether they know, however we have, thanks to our film archive evidence of its being worn by Bert Maunder our very own Town Crier! He appears in the RAF Association's film of Callington in the 1950s, the actual film being from 1955. Now not to miss an opportunity and with mischievous intent, this hat is a dead ringer for Capt Poldark's, I rather think that in a nice glass cabinet with a title "as worn by Aiden Turner" we could improve our visitor numbers exponentially! Talking of the film archive, here we go again back to Dr Trowbridge, who I noticed makes a cameo appearance, in a recent viewing of the 1956 film, taking part in The Callington Show, he was wearing a white coat, so obviously judging something or other. This film, in full colour, documents the show and its many events, including Gymkhana, PT Display, RM Band and spectacular Flower and Produce Tent. Interestingly, it shows the people of Callington, many recognisable, enjoying a sunny Summer event, which judging by the number of cars parked around the perimeter of the field, was a sell out, not quite as big as The Royal Cornwall but just as professional. As I grew up through that era, I was really surprised by the number of cars present, must have been wealthy Farmers!! Oh before I go, I had a recent visit from a gentleman who grew up in Callington related to the "Battens", he went on to school at The Camborne School of Mines, emigrated to the USA and spent his life in Mining, he is going to pay us a return visit to continue his enquiries. Well as Fred Quimby used to say "Thats all Folks", why don't you come out to Liskeard Road and pay us a visit, you will receive a warm welcome. 
