



CALLINGTON CARNIVAL



With a host of committed entries to the Carnival already received, the 2018 Callington Carnival promises to be one to remember, so do make sure that Saturday 8th September is firmly in your diary and that you are out and about in town to enjoy the spectacle.

As ever, the main procession will leave the Saltash Road Car Park at 4.30pm, this year moving down Saltash Road to the traffic lights and then turning left into Fore Street, which will give a much better view as the parade approaches the town centre. It will then continue along Liskeard Road as far as the museum and then turn left into Westover and come out at the primary school, to turn right and return to the car park. In essence the route has been reversed and also slightly shortened, to allow for easier participation for people of all ages and abilities.

If you live along the route, please make sure that cars are not parked on the road during this time – and if you use the Saltash Road car park, please remove your car/van for the entire day on the Saturday to allow for easy access for floats and the setting up of the parade. It should be available for normal use after 6.00pm

There is still plenty of time to make an entry yourself, whether it be on a float, as a commercial vehicle to promote your business or organisation, or as a walking entry. We would ask vehicle entries to enrol at least 48 hours before the start, but walking entries can be made on the day.

In the past, there has never been an official theme for entries, but this year there is a suggested guideline of “Centenaries” or “Anniversaries” as 2018 marks a number of historical milestones. Nevertheless, have no fear, other entries will be warmly welcomed!

There is a surprise extra procession of at least 20 vehicles which will precede the main parade so make sure you are out and about in plenty of time to enjoy the fun.



LOCAL MEMBERS OF THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION TO REPRESENT Callington and District Branch AT WW1 COMEMORATIONS IN BELGIUM

Jason Bond and June Trevithick travelled to Europe for The Royal British Legion's Great Pilgrimage 90 on 5-9th August 2018

Members of the **Callington and District** branch of The Royal British Legion joined thousands on a pilgrimage of Remembrance to World War One battlefield that culminated in a parade and ceremony in Ypres as part of the end of the First World War centenary commemorations.

The Royal British Legion event, known as Great Pilgrimage 90 (GP90), took place between the 5th and 9th of August and was one of the largest in the charity's history.

GP90 marked 90 years since the original Royal British Legion Pilgrimage in 1928, which saw 11,000 World War One veterans and war widows visit the battlefields of the Somme in France and Ypres in Belgium, a decade after the conflict ended.

That Pilgrimage culminated in a march through Ypres to the Commonwealth War Grave Commission's Menin Gate Memorial for a ceremony to commemorate the launch of The Hundred Days Offensive and in remembrance of those who never returned.

Local Legion members Jason Bond and June Trevithick represented the Callington and District Branch and the local community at the event, as Standard Bearer and wreath layer respectively.

Jason and June toured some of the same battlefields and cemeteries visited by those on the 1928 Pilgrimage, before marching along the original route through Ypres, to the Menin Gate on the 8th August, bearing their branch standard and a wreath.

They joined more than 2,200 other Legion representatives and dignitaries, including Civic and military guests from the UK, Commonwealth and Northern Europe who took part. Once at the Menin Gate, June will laid a wreath on behalf of the Callington and District community.

Jason Bond, Chairman and Standard of the Callington and District Branch of The Royal British Legion, said: "Great Pilgrimage 90 was a unique opportunity for the Legion community to come together and bear our Standards along the same route in Ypres taken 90 years earlier by the veterans and widows of the First World War. We were proud to represent Callington and District at the event."

As local champions of Remembrance, the Callington and District Branch of The Royal British Legion is working in partnership with the community to bring their unique Remembrance message to the Menin Gate, on their wreath, where it was displayed in a wreath installation for viewing by the general public until the end of August.

Callington Heritage Centre

Now you may remember me referring to the unusual configuration of Pengelly Jewellers in Fore Street and the revelation that at some point in the 19th Century it was likely a Public House/Coaching Inn. However in an age when Publicans came and went frequently and their Inns changed names just as frequently, we are able to make an attempt to identify it. The best candidate being The Town Arms, and possible landlord being John Toms having been referred to in the Sherborne Mercury as a victualler in 1791. Two years later on the 1793 map of the town he is indicated in a building between The Wellington Inn and Well Street. The only time the name "Town Arms" occurs however is in the 1861 census with James Babb as Innkeeper, (and this is what I think nails it) " being eleven schedules (households) along from the Bulls Head." Allowing for the fact that one property sometimes had two doors to allow access to the rooming houses above, as well as the shop below and that I think takes you along to Pengelly's.

At this time Callington was stuffed full of Pubs and the population had grown immensely due to the influx of the Mining Community, this naturally declined with the failing of the Mines and the Miners themselves migrating to more promising locations in the USA, Australia and South Africa.

I refer you to our publication "Tipplers and Teetotallers" which covers the Pubs, Beer Houses and Ale joints in Callington and surrounding Parishes. Returning to our "Dr Trowbridge" theme and his brief appearance in the 1956 film of Callington, where at The Callington Show he was wearing a white coat. I rather hastily assumed he was, as was the custom, engaged in the judging. Thanks to Mark Trowbridge we have come up with a far more likely explanation "that he was overseeing the First Aid Tent and the St John's Ambulance volunteers"- now why didn't I think of that?

Staying on the subject of health, did you know that Callington had an outbreak of Poliomyelitis in 1947/48? In all ,there were six cases, five probably infected from the same source, all developed paralysis between 29th December 1947 and 11th Jan 1948. The Polio virus spread through contaminated water or through contact with those carriers who demonstrated inadequate hygiene. The virus ultimately attacked the nerves and spinal cord leading to paralysis. Needless to say a degree of panic must have ensued, open water sources including the well in Well Street were boarded up, it was felt that this source had become contaminated with the run off from The Cattle Market. Dr Trowbridge as the Town's doctor at the time was heavily involved with dealing with the patients and subsequent measures to contain it. I think we can all be very grateful, as I think country life was very caught up and dependent on local wells which we as kids used to drink from.


One other aspect of this which does not immediately occur, was the use of swimming baths or pools. Our local pool was in Harrowbarrow and I can remember going by coach from the Grammar School to the pool in the park at Launceston to do elementary swimming tests. Thankfully, by then one assumes, the late 50s early 60s it was found that by the use of chlorine such dangers were eradicated. Polio now is prevented by the use of a vaccine and remains endemic in only three countries of the world. Do you remember those ghastly injections at school?




