Callington residents will be able to access a range of Cornwall Council services at their local library when the Information Service (IS) moves to its new home on Friday 30th November 2018.

Currently, people using the IS at Callington Town Hall have access to a computer and telephone to help them find out more about Council services and to make payments online. However, the move to the Library means that customers will receive the support of the Library and Information Service staff who can help with enquiries and signposting to relevant Cornwall Council services. The move also means users can benefit from free parking, printing facilities and more computers with internet access.



## CALLINGTON & KELLY BRAY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

### Community consultation and call for sites

The Steering Group and consultant team held a very well attended consultation event on 27th and 28th July at the Town Hall. Over 140 people visited over two days to provide their views on what is important to the area and to share their ideas on how current problems could be tackled. Discussions covered a wide range of issues, including the local economy and town centre, transport, housing, health and wellbeing, the local environment and community issues. Helen Dowdall, Clerk to the Town Council commented that "we were really pleased to see so many people from Callington and Kelly Bray visit the Town Hall and share their views. We were able to gather lots of ideas, and the consultant team will now work to take these into account in the next stage of the project". It is not too late for anyone to share their thoughts and a copy of the consultation form is also available on the same page, or available at the Town Hall. Alongside the consultation, the Town Council has also recently asked local land owners to submit details of land that they think might be suitable for development of homes, employment areas and community facilities. This is because the Neighbourhood Plan is required to make provision for new development in the future and it is important to identify the best sites for that. The call for sites has helped to give us the best possible selection to choose from.

### Next steps

The consultant team are currently reviewing the consultation responses that we have received. Over the next month they will be visiting all of the sites that have been submitted for consideration and reviewing these against a set of criteria; including access, highway impact, flood risk and the impact on landscape and the environment. They will then assess what type of development the sites may be suitable for in the future. The team will also be meeting with a range of business and key organisations to discuss their views and ideas for the future. Following that, the Steering Group and consultant team will move towards preparing a draft Vision that takes account of people's views. This will then go through a second consultation process early in 2019, which the public will be able to comment on again before preparation work starts on the Neighbourhood Plan. We will be providing regular updates on the project in the Callington News and through the Town Council's website, Facebook page and Twitter feed.

## MERRYHUE FARM HOSTS UNIQUE REMEMBRANCE EVENT

On Thursday November 1<sup>st</sup>, Merryhue Farm was host to 75 primary school children from Sir Robert Geffreys School at Landrake, St Dominic C of E VA Primary School, and St Mellion C of E VA Primary School, who came together for a very special event.

“There But Not There” was a day event to commemorate and celebrate the end of World War 1, and to remember not only the soldiers who served but also the people left at home and the impact of the war on our local rural communities. Merryhue staff and volunteers were helped throughout the day by cadets from Duchy College and Devon Army Cadet Force, all of whom were enthusiastic and cheerful, and helped to answer all the questions from some very excited children.

The day was full of activity from beginning to end. The replica trench was great fun. Ossie Glover, a former Royal Marine, took the children through the trench, complete with life-like models of rats, and explained what everyday life was like for soldiers on the front line. The children climbed the sniper’s ladders and looked down the barrel of a (decommissioned) WW1 rifle over no-man’s land.

From there, it was on to a calmer but no less enthralling question and answer session with Harry Staff, a local military historian. We learned how a cavalryman would have to chop off his dead horse’s hoof and take it to his commander to get a new horse! Harry also showed us some snakes made of tiny beads by POWs in Turkey in WW1, some of which had messages embedded into the beads.

After a packed lunch down by the field kitchen (more of that later) we turned our hand to crafts – making poppies from tissue paper and colouring. We also planted acorns and sweet chestnuts, each with a named cross remembering one of the local fallen. These will eventually be planted up at Merryhue as a memorial avenue.

The children then took the minibus up to the top of the site to meet the giant Poitou donkeys which were used for breeding mules for use in the war, and to meet the two day old lamb born to our Swiss Valais Black Nosed sheep – no war connection there, just very cute.

At the end of the day we all gathered at the field kitchen to try some of the food the soldiers would have eaten at the frontline, cooked by Steve, a Royal Navy veteran. Goat and pea soup was a firm favourite, as was the corn bread with corned beef stew.

Then it was time for a more sombre moment. Children, teachers, staff, volunteers and cadets gathered together to remember all those who died in the war. Cheryl read “For the Fallen” a poem by Lawrence Binyon, then one of the cadets bugled the last post, followed by two minute’s silence. After the reveille was sounded Merryhue staff read fifteen names from a list of local soldiers who died, to represent the loss to the community.

The day was a huge success, with several teachers saying it was “the best school trip they’d been on”.

With the enthusiasm of dozens of local people, including Callington Community College pupils, and supported by Tesco's 'Bags of Help' scheme, Callington Town Band re-ran its WW1 Commemoration, 'And Some Came Home', in Callington Town Hall for three performances to packed houses.

Written by Shirley Morse and first performed in 2014, the story of the first world war was interleaved with tales of how the people of Callington rose to the occasion holding fund-raising concerts, offering support to Belgian refugees and sending their young men off to the war.

Songs of the period, 'Pack up Your Troubles', 'Good-bye, Dolly Gray' and many more, were sung with great gusto by the cast and were often in stark contrast to the words written home by the servicemen of all nationalities.

Thanks must go to Jenny Coombe who had accompanied the singers through many hours of rehearsals and performances, and to everyone who helped with projection, lighting, refreshments - and taking part.

## Invisible ME

**Invisible ME: A new Association seeking to build a support network for ME/CFS sufferers and carers in East Cornwall and surrounding area and to raise greater awareness of this debilitating condition.**

*Invisible ME* is a new initiative seeking to build a support network for sufferers and carers of people with ME/CFS in S.E. Cornwall and surrounding area, which was launched this autumn at The Old School, Stoke Climsland.

ME/CFS, Myalgic Encephalomyelitis/Chronic Fatigue Syndrome, is a debilitating disease classified as a neurological illness by the World Health Authority. Its causes are not understood and the lack of a specific diagnostic test makes diagnosis difficult. Sufferers show a range of symptoms and its impact on their lives is profound. There is no known cure so treatment has to focus on the relief of symptoms.

There is controversy regarding some "treatments" currently recommended by NICE, the National Institute for Clinical Excellence. Patient concern regarding these management strategies, coupled with developments in biomedical research, have been instrumental in the NHS decision to review the NICE guidelines for doctors and other involved agencies and carers.

# Callington Heritage Centre

Firstly, apologies to Margaret Pearce who was the true source of the information on the location of "Trafalgar Square, Kelly Bray". My piece was altered after submission, in good faith, by someone who thought it came from Daphne Pearce. Unfortunately, the item went to press before it could be put right.

On a similar theme, you may recall I was asking for the origins of the road name "Hangmans Lane" after someone called into the Heritage Centre asking just that. Well in the week, I had a call from Susan Tolman quick off the blocks, who said that at the bottom of said road, there was a farm called "Angwins Farm" and this became corrupted in Cornese to "Hangmans". Well all I can say is, we have some pretty clever residents, but sadly no gallows!

It has been brought to my attention that a small parcel of land surrounded by a stone wall situated on the other side of the lane bordering Appleby Lodge on Launceston Road, Kelly Bray is up for sale. Well, this brought boyhood memories flooding back, as we boys (Bryants, Glover) used to refer to it as "Churchyard" although it had clearly not been used for burials. It was populated by oak trees which we were disposed to frequently climb, it was here I encountered the pitiful sight of a facially deformed rabbit suffering from myxomatosis. On Sundays, after Sunday School, Mr Bryant, Peter, Robert, Jane and myself used to embark on a "Nature Walk" down this winding lane which took us down towards Maders and Jericho, eventually to Fernley Rundles land. It was not until many years later that some information, or should I say speculation, about the Churchyard site and adjacent lane came to light. Apparently, it was planned to build a daughter Chapel there for the residents of Kelly Bray who couldn't walk all the way to Stoke Climsland Church on a Sunday. This was never done and the Duchy Land Steward confirms that the piece of land in question, 0.17 hectare, has been owned by the Duchy for many years and has never been let or sold. More interestingly, and this is where the speculation comes in, the lane now referred to as "Totterdown Lane" (never heard it called that before) was used by pall bearers before the Church in Callington was built in order for the deceased to be buried in South Hill Church. Sounds a bit far fetched to me – well I guess it would have been.

Well enough of those ramblings, it's been a good year, the Exhibition was well received, we have benefited from community funding and our visitor numbers were up. We are extremely lucky as a community to have this facility which keeps Callington on the map for all around the world to see. We are the keepers of the past, without which we can have little understanding of the "whys and wherefores" of the present. We will be maintaining a winter presence on Friday afternoons between 12 noon and 4.00pm. 


