Please remember that, by law, you are required to clean up after your dog has fouled in any area which the public are entitled to and have access to. Dog waste must be properly disposed of either deposited in dog bins provided or taken home and put in your household waste.

Failing to clean up after your dog has fouled will result in a fixed penalty fine of £100 being issued or prosecution where, if found guilty, you would face a maximum fine of £1,000.



## FORE STREET - PARTIAL ROAD CLOSURE Festive Light Repairs

Fore Street will be partially closed in August on Tuesday 27th, Wednesday 28th and Thursday 29th for essential repairs to the festive lights in the Town. Access will be for buses and emergency vehicles.

**Why these repairs you may ask?** The electrics for the Christmas lights have been causing some problems for a few years, in fact, last year they flickered on and off whenever there was any wind. Those of you with long memories will know that some of these electrics are thirty years old!

Callington Town Council now have the funds to repair the electrics and these repairs will take place on the dates above. A 'rolling' road closure will be put in place so that only part of the road will be closed at any one time. The Town Council have employed a professional company to handle the road closure ensuring that everything is kept legal and safe.

**South Hill Horticultural Show's 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday and you are all invited!**



# Callington Heritage Centre

Well, more than half way through the year and Summer, as I write this, has yet to arrive. What did arrive in the post the other day, courtesy of Bernard Maker were several wartime letters dating from 1942/43 from Callington Servicemen mostly addressed to Mr Folley and the Callington Brotherhood. Why you may ask? Well it transpires that the Brotherhood were instrumental in sending food parcels and other items of a more practical nature to our boys serving in the various fields of battle. This comes as we commemorate the 75th Anniversary of 'D' Day and serves as a reminder of the contribution our own men and women made in those troubled times. Put together with the extracts (some already published by myself from the WI archives) and we will have a very nice display under glass, which the public will be able to see for themselves. And, if we needed to be reminded of the wonderful works and deeds carried out by Mr Folley and members of the Callington Brotherhood who throughout those times saw to it that the elderly, poor and disadvantaged of the Community were not left wanting, even enjoying day trips to the seaside. Much like the Lions and The Round Table today, Callington has always benefited from the efforts of those philanthropic individuals who put themselves out to help others. Other items coming in included one of those long roll photographs showing Callington Grammar School staff and pupils taken in 1958. It is particularly nice to see these again especially as I can be clearly seen without the sun shining on my head.

Also contained in the goody bag was a set of colour coded dominoes to assist younger players who hadn't yet mastered numeracy and a Kodak 125 in mint boxed condition. Who says volunteering is dull?

Oh yes, one more thing. We have had an enquiry about the origins and history of the parcel of land opposite 'Smithees' at the bottom of Church Street. What used to occupy this site can anyone remember? My Mum and I used to walk past it on the way out to Kelly Bray after watching a film in the Town Hall, replete with Gimblett's Fish and Chips. But that was a long time ago!

Visitors are continuing to enjoy our current display of Callington businesses and historic photos. They particularly love the colour film of the town in the mid 1950s, all we need is some cinema seating and an usherette. Anyone remember Mrs Strutt?



At the beginning of the 19th Century pilchard fishing was St Ives' main industry. The town became a 'dirty' place to visit. As the water supply and poor drainage was improved, the railway linked St Erth to St Ives - it became a place which attracted visitors.

In the latter 1800s artists came to draw and paint encouraged by the special light of Cornwall. Artists hired rooms and studios living with fisherfolk and involved themselves in the community.

We saw magnificent examples of figure, marine and landscape paintings from many artists in the St Ives colony. One artist was William Titcomb, one of the early settlers, who was David's great grandfather. William used many of the fishermen as models in his work.


