#### 6. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

a) PA21/00290, Hillside, 155 Launceston Road. Proposed first floor extension.

**Resolved.** It was proposed by Cllr Tagg seconded by Cllr Watson to have no objection to the application subject to consultation with neighbours, specifically those to the left and right and the neighbor

behind on any overlooking issues and that the Highways Officer being satisfied that the access and egress can be done safely. (3 support, 5 against, 1 abstention)

The resolution could not be carried. Further discussions took place.

**Resolved.** It was proposed by Cllr Gold seconded by Cllr Morgan and agreed to refuse the application due to the cramped nature of the development creates an overdevelopment of the site and such the living conditions would not be acceptable. (5 support, 3 against, 1 abstention)

b) PA21/00761, 9 Hazelwood Road. Proposed single storey side/rear extension

**Resolved.** It was proposed by Cllr Tolman seconded by Cllr Coakley and agreed to support the application subject to consultation with neighbours. (8 support, 1 abstention)

### 7. DECISIONS

a) PA20/10623 Florence Road Industrial Estate, Florence Road, Kelly Bray, Callington PL17 8EG - Works to trees covered by a Tree Preservation Order - To discuss proposals or a preferred area which might be suitable for the replanting of the replacement trees (email sent on 3<sup>rd</sup> February). Agent will be in attendance

Cllr Gold thanked Mr Johnson for the replacement trees. A discussion took place with regard to the planting of these trees. Cllr Gold suggested that some of these trees could be used to replace the missing memorial trees on Launceston Road. The OM would be asked to count the number of people who were lost in WWI from the War Memorial and assess how many replacement trees were required. The idea of 5-6 trees being planted at the Primary School was supported in principle but it was appreciated that there is very little space at the School to accommodate many trees.

Others trees could be planted on the grass beside the bus shelter at Kelly Bray and Launceston Road Recreation Ground and some could be planted at Guipavas Road to replace the vandalized/damaged trees that had been planted there in the past. A newsletter article would be written for the next newsletter, thanking the company who donated the trees and informing residents of where they had been planted and why.

Mr Johnson agreed to have a look at these locations to get an idea of how many trees would be required. He would then put them in to a replanting scheme for submission to, and approval from, Cornwall Council.

**Resolved.** It was proposed by Cllr Gold seconded by Cllr Long and unanimously agreed that Mr Johnson submit a replanting scheme based on the suggestion of locations above, to Cornwall Council for their amendment and/or approval.
