Are you interested in becoming a Town Councillor?



Callington Town Council has TWO vacancies for a Councillor and will be filling these vacancies by the co-option process (see page 12). The Town Council meets on the first, third and fourth Tuesday of the month in the Council Chamber, with additional meetings being held as, and if, necessary.

Why would I want to become a Town Councillor?

Local councils can only be as effective, relevant and vibrant as the people elected to run it, so we need councillors who are capable, energetic and engaged – from all backgrounds and experiences to reflect their communities. Being a Councillor is highly rewarding. No other role gives you a chance to make such a huge difference to the quality of life of people in your local area and to influence the way issues are dealt with locally. There are many reasons why you might like to become a Councillor:

- to make a difference and help shape the future of the local community
- concern about your local area and wanting to ensure the community gets the right services
- to represent the views of local people and ensure that community interests are taken into account
- concern about a specific issue and wanting to do something about it
- having good ideas for the council and community in a time of scarce resources
- to contribute your skills
- to build on other community work through a charity, voluntary group or school governing body
- to pursue your political ambitions and contribute to your community

it can be a career-enhancing activity, allowing you to develop leadership and analytical skills and to obtain practical and managerial work experience.

You can become a Councillor as long as you are:

- British or a citizen of the Commonwealth or European Union
- At least 18 years old
- Registered to vote in the area or have lived (within three miles), worked or owned property there

If you are in any doubt about whether you are eligible to stand as a Councillor, you should contact the electoral services department at Cornwall Council for advice.


Message from incoming Portreeve and Mayor, CLlr Mike Tagg:

Public Conveniences Refurbishment

The refurbishment of the Public Conveniences on New Road is now complete!

The new facilities provide individual unisex toilets, which are all disabled friendly, and baby changing facilities with the addition of a Changing Places facility. Changing Places toilets provide the necessary equipment for people with profound and multiple learning difficulties as well as people with physical disabilities such as spinal injuries, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis who often need extra equipment and space to allow them to use a toilet safely and comfortably. Each Changing Places toilet will provide a height adjustable adult sized changing bench, a tracking hoist system, or mobile hoist. Adequate space in the changing area for disabled people as well as up to two carers, a centrally placed toilet with room either side and a screen or curtain to allow for privacy.

Local Community Group Recognised with National Award



Battling On CIC were named as the winners of the Covid Response Hero Award on Thursday 25th March in a virtual ceremony held by UK wide charity Social Farms & Gardens. Gardeners, farmers and community champions tuned in from all over the country to hear some incredible stories about how green spaces are being used to farm, garden and grow together. The awards had originally been planned to mark the organisation's 40th birthday in 2020 but were postponed due to the pandemic.

Winners were selected from hundreds of nominations received for seven separate categories, with an extra "Covid Response Hero" awarded on the night to recognise the incredible efforts made by the winner to support communities through the pandemic.

Despite the virtual nature of the ceremony, there was a real sense of community and fun throughout with presenters "revealing" winner names from gold envelopes and winners sharing their stories.

Judges felt Battling On CIC addressed a huge range of needs in their community exacerbated by the Covid 19 pandemic. *"While providing solutions to many immediate needs such as providing food parcels and activity kits, the team also took a strategic approach building partnerships with other organisations and showed a real ability to engage volunteers."* It was felt that as well as being a hero to many people with immediate needs this past year, Battling On's activities have left local support networks in a stronger position than this time last year.

Battling On is a multi-award-winning, not-for-profit, Community Interest Company that was established in 2012 to support members of the Armed Forces struggling in civilian life. Battling On is situated on a Care Farm between Callington and Liskeard in Cornwall and supports veterans from Plymouth, West Devon and Cornwall.

As Battling On has grown it has developed a unique model to support not only veterans but the wider community. Battling On utilises the skills of veterans by training them to support the most vulnerable members of our community such as the elderly, individuals with life limiting illnesses or disabilities, vulnerable young people etc.

To list a few of Battling On's activities over the last year they distributed 500 creative learning packs to support young people, provided 200 arts and craft packs to those shielding with weekly art/ craft lessons provided via Zoom, provided 1200 veterans cooked lunches and distributed over 250 festive food boxes with frozen Christmas lunches to the elderly and provided a 24/7 crisis helpline.

Nikki Markham, the Founding Director, said on receiving the Covid Hero Award, "this is a tremendous honour and full credit for it should go the team of staff and volunteers who have been working tirelessly over the last year.



We are based in a rural community and fundamental to farming life is the ethos of pulling together to overcome adversity. You couple this with the veterans drive to support and serve and you have a powerful movement for change. I see this as only the beginning and as we come out of lockdown, we must continue to support those in need, and it is through grassroot organisations such as ours that we can ensure the most vulnerable are not forgotten."

Once again, Callington Town Council is holding an art competition to create three murals to be installed on the wall above Lloyds Pharmacy in New Road, opposite Bradleys Estate Agents. The initial creations will be completed on an A4 sheet of paper with the winning entries to be created by the winning artists, on three marine plywood boards (1701.8mm x 1219.2mm x 12mm). The mural boards will stay up for one year so they must be made weather-proof. £60, for each board, will be given to the winning artists to pay for materials

This competition will be run annually.

Entries close on 25th August 2021. Entries will be judged by a panel chaired by the Mayor Portreeve. The winning murals must be completed and ready to erect on the wall by 29th September in time for Honey Fair on 6th October 2021.

RNID Communication Tips for someone with hearing loss



Awareness

Make people aware that you are deaf or have a hearing loss and your preferred communication style



Facemasks

In public spaces, such as shops and public transport, you are exempt from wearing a face covering if you cannot wear your hearing aid or cochlear implant processor securely with a covering, or if this will interfere with your processor



Social distancing

You can also ask people to maintain social distancing and lower their face covering if you need them to add this to communicate with you

Where lip reading is possible:



Face to face
Make sure they face you and you can see their face clearly



Full attention
Make sure the person gets your attention before they start speaking



Speak normally
Ask them to speak normally and not exaggerate their lip movements

When visual cues are not possible:

The below are particularly important when someone cannot use visual cues, such as on the telephone or when wearing a mask:



Speak clearly

Ask them to clearly and not to cover their mouth when speaking

Re-phrase

Ask them to repeat or say things differently if you do not understand what they have said

Technology

Use assistive devices like remote microphones with hearing aids to improve the quality of speech over background noise

Background noise

Reduce background noise as much as possible by moving to a quieter space.

Write it down

Write things down use pen on paper, text on device screens or whiteboards

Interpreter

If possible, ask them to speak to a relative or friend


In total since the start of 2020 354 LCIF Grants, totalling **£4million**, have been awarded across the world to help with the global pandemic.

As an example, to combat COVID, Lions Clubs worked with Air Ambulances UK to compile a list of equipment and supplies needed by individual air ambulance charities and funded £162,000 for this.

Tesco Introduce More Plastic Recycling

Tesco have added extra plastic collection cages alongside their carrier bags recycling to the 171 stores in the South West, including those in Launceston, Tavistock and Callington.

The additional cage is for “soft” plastics, i.e. not hard/rigid plastic, which includes crinkly plastic from some of the following examples:

- * wrappers from salad items: celery, tomatoes, cucumber
 - * some fruits and veg: peppers, spinach, apples
 - * film off punnets of fruit, trays of veg and meat
 - * sleeves and film lids off yoghurt pots
 - * packets of sauces
 - * cereal, muesli, granola and oat bags
 - * noodles, rice and pasta packets
 - * dried fruit, sugar in plastic bags
 - * crumpets, thins and naan packaging
- (pretty much all the food packaging that RECYCLING FOR CHARITY cannot take)

The cages are located in the lobby by the exit in Launceston. In Callington they are just before the exit into the lobby and in Tavistock there are through the checkouts, but not close to the exit. Continue to put stretchy plastic (sometimes labelled LDPE 4) with the carrier bag recycling, such as:

- * shrink wrap from cans
- * bubble wrap
- * postal bags
- * frozen chips and peas packets
- * spuds and apple bags
- * nets from fruit and garlic
- * carrier bags

Sarah Bradbury, Tesco’s Director of Quality, said ‘reducing and recycling plastics is such an important issue for us, for customers and for the future of our planet. That is why we are working hard to reduce the amount of packaging in our stores and have committed that all remaining packaging will be recyclable by 2025.’

Please continue to support RECYCLING FOR CHARITY on Facebook where you will find details on collection points and times as well as information about current and new items that can be accepted. Save your items and drop off at Green Meadows, Golberdon or any of the local collection points listed on the website or on Facebook.

- * Bread bags that are stretchy (all others can now go to TESCO)
- * Cheese packets include Baby Bel nets, labels and wax
- * Crisp and all snacks packets
- * Baby food and Pet food pouches (washed)
- * Biscuit and cracker packets and cake wrappers
- * Sweet and chocolate wrappers
- * Toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes, soft tubes and pots from creams, gels, ointments etc.
- * Triggers and hand pumps, roll on deodorants, LATEX style gloves and Marigolds
- * Cleaning wipes and dishwasher packets and tubs, plastic air fresheners
- * Pens and inkjet cartridges
- * Medicine Blister Packs like paracetamol and your medicines.
