

Another Virtual Honey Fair



Callington and District Lions confirm that they have reluctantly agreed that this year's Honey Fair will again have to be a virtual event.



Incoming President Jamie Dowdall said that it had been hoped Honey Fair, always held on the first Wednesday in October, could return to its normal community day, providing a social occasion allowing people from far and wide to meet. This was especially as within the last year John Trevithick had passed away; John had reintroduced Honey Fair in 1978.

However, Jamie added that last year's Virtual Honey Fair (VHF) had proved a popular event with many on-line participating activities and, thanks to the generosity of local people, a total of £2,200 had been raised.

This money had been put to good use helping in the community with contributions being made to Callington Food Bank, Cornwall Air Ambulance, Plymouth Soup Run, wheelchair provision, and many other worthwhile causes.

Jamie added that Lions will have some of the popular virtual events as last year where the public can join in, maybe just for fun, but also to help fund local charities.

Lions are also considering if VHF could be bigger and better this October and be a time for more community activities, even with Covid-19 Restrictions in mind, such as:

- Order a cream tea to be delivered to you/ a friend's home as a special treat
- Raise money by having a 'mufti-day' at your school/ business
- Have an on-line musical/ art/ creative competition

COVID 19 - MOVING TO STEP 4 FROM 19TH JULY



While many restrictions will be lifted, COVID-19 has not gone away so it is important that we remain cautious. By practising key behaviours we can continue to protect ourselves and others and help stop the virus spreading. If you develop COVID-19 symptoms, however mild, you should get a PCR test and must self isolate if you test positive or if you are told to by the NHS Test and Trace.

Keeping yourself and others safe:

- ◆ There will no longer be any restrictions on meeting friends or family and no limits on the number of people you can meet. Try to meet others outdoors where COVID-19 particles are blown away. If you are meeting indoors, open windows to let the fresh air in.
- ◆ There will be no limit on the number of people who can attend weddings, civil partnerships, funerals and other life events.
- ◆ All capacity limits at sporting, entertainment or business event have been lifted.
- ◆ Consider limiting close contact with people you do not live with.
- ◆ There is no longer an instruction to work from home, but Government expects and recommends a gradual return over the summer.
- ◆ Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitiser regularly throughout the day.
- ◆ All remaining businesses and venues such as nightclubs, discos and adult entertainment venues can re-open.
- ◆ It is expected and recommended that people wear face coverings in crowded areas such as public transport.
- ◆ Hospitality venues such as pubs, restaurants and bars are no longer required to provide table service.
- ◆ Keep Bluetooth contact tracing enabled on your NHS COVID-19 app and use the app to report symptoms, get a test and check in to venues.

That is, of course, unless you are a savvy shopper who knows about the Callington Country Market, where all the above delights are a reality and not a wistful reminiscence of happier shopping times. We open our doors every Wednesday morning, from 8.45am to 12noon in the Town Hall, although even before you make it through the doors you will be greeted with the sight of the most amazing hand-made wooden creations: tables, cabinets, wine racks, garden trugs etc. There is also a wonderful array of beautiful plants and flowers which continues inside with beautiful cut flowers and yet more plants.



The Country Market also offers a positive treasure-trove of the most unique, lovingly hand-crafted pieces made by talented local crafters and artists. An eclectic mix of original work to give as a most thoughtful gift or a little something frivolous to lift your own spirits, goodness knows, we could all do with a little lift these days. From art work to cards, hand-knits to hand-painted glass, jewellery, fabric creations, engraved slate, perfumed soaps - the list goes on!

Finally, with restrictions set to be lifted, we are delighted that our cafe will be reopening, offering tired shoppers an opportunity to down bags and baskets and enjoy a reviving cup of something refreshing. There is a lovely friendly and welcoming atmosphere in the Country Market and it is the perfect place to relax and take a break, and perhaps contemplate going back to that stall to pick up that perfect little gift for Aunty Marjory (other Aunties are of course available ...).

Once again, Callington Town Council is holding an art competition to create three murals to be installed on the wall above Lloyds Pharmacy in New Road, opposite Bradleys Estate Agents. The initial creations will be completed on an A4 sheet of paper with the winning entries to be created by the winning artists, on three marine plywood boards (1701.8mm x 1219.2mm x 12mm). The mural boards will stay up for one year so they must be made weather-proof. £60, for each board, will be given to the winning artists to pay for materials

This competition will be run annually.

Entries close on 25th August 2021. Entries will be judged by a panel chaired by the Mayor and Portreeve. The winning murals must be completed and ready to erect on the wall by 29th September.

Broadband speeds to get a welcome boost in Callington!



Cornish broadband provider, Wildanet, has announced it will be bringing fibre broadband to the Callington area, providing access to internet speeds around 40 times faster than the average connection in Cornwall.

Earlier this year, the Liskeard-based firm announced it was investing over £50million to build a brand new high-speed broadband network to connect many areas of Cornwall that are still without access to fast, reliable internet, and creating many new jobs in the process.

Cornwall still has countless communities suffering with poor quality internet connection, making life harder for many families and businesses in these areas and putting them at a distinct disadvantage to the rest of the UK. Wildanet is working to change this.

How will the new fibre broadband benefit Callington?

For families, it means a fast, reliable connection at all times across all devices such as laptops, smart phones, tablets, smart TVs, smart watches, wireless speakers and online gaming. It means everything from working at home, to streaming and downloading movies, watching TV on-demand, playing the latest video games online, online banking and video-calling friends and family - all without any loss of connection.

For businesses, it means being able to provide an enhanced service to customers, and giving staff access to a fast, reliable connection to help them work more productively. It means being able to use web-based business tools to collaborate online and work more efficiently. In fact, whatever your business, Wildanet's new broadband service will help you do more, and do it faster.

When will fibre broadband be available in Callington?

Wildanet are expecting to start connecting people from as early as October this year. Their team are currently in the area talking to local residents to let them know about the new service. Look out for their representatives who can be identified by the Wildanet-branded clothing and ID badges.

Will there be any disruption?

There will be some development work, such as digging of roads, occasional road closures and crossing of private land, but Wildanet are keen to work with the community, local Councillors and landowners to keep any disruption to an absolute minimum and keep residents and businesses updated on progress throughout the build.

What makes Wildanet different from other broadband providers?

Some providers are only able to provide fibre to the nearest cabinet (the green boxes you see in the street), and then rely on the old copper network to link the cabinet to your property. This is known as Fibre to the Cabinet (FTTC) and means you're not getting anywhere near the full speeds that full-fibre can offer because the bandwidth is still restricted by the copper cable link from the cabinet to your home or business.

Wildanet is different because they are providing a full-fibre service (known as Fibre to the Property – FTTP). This means you get a hyperfast fibre service delivered all the way up to your front door.

How to find out more

Wildanet will be holding an open day at Callington Town Hall on Friday 10 September where you can find out more about the roll-out and ask the team any questions you may have. To register your interest in the event (and the new broadband service), please enter your details at www.wildanet.com/PL17 and Wildanet will keep you updated on the open day and the roll-out in general.




Accepted items include empty packets from:





St Mary's Square in Callington was alive with creativity on Saturday 3rd July as the community gathered to paint murals of the local area. Adults, teens and children together brushed and daubed acrylic paint onto pre-designed boards, bringing to life stunning images of Cadsonbury Hill Fort, Callington allotments and Fire Station, the Donkey Park, and Callington Newbridge.

The Town Square buzzed with conversation and laughter as guests embraced the joy and spirituality of creativity. Up to one hundred people took part in the project, which was visited by Callington's Portreeve and Deputy Mayor. The local Methodist Minister, Reverend David Moss, skillfully painted strawberries which looked good enough to eat. Once completed, the murals will be exhibited in shop windows in Callington, adding to the stunning array of permanent murals displayed on many of the Town's buildings.

Callington Methodist Church, alongside her sister churches of Stoke Climsland, St Dominick and Tamar Valley, offered the free event to bring people together as lockdown eases and to live-out God's love and creativity in the community.
