# Callington Heritage Centre

Well here we are, with hopefully the first of many items for the Callington News.

We opened on Friday 30th July, which was a bit of a foul day with rain all morning, however, we had our first visitors. Among them, a family of four who had moved to Callington only three years ago and wanted to learn more about the history of the town. I think we made it entertaining and informative and despite their long stay, we just about scratched the surface!

As we have yet to establish a routine, this bulletin will contain random thoughts. During the recent closure I was sent a Newspaper cutting with a piece by our very own Lawrence Maker. Taken from the Western Morning News from August 21 1961, it covered, at length, the demolitions taking place in the town at that time: rows of age old dwellings in Church Street and Pear Tree Row; the clearance of walls in Fore St adjacent to and once part of Goldings Hotel, (latterly The Blue Cap). Street names which for generations have been part and parcel of Callington, Compton Street, Compton Cottages, Pear Tree Row, disappeared forever. Reference was also made to the "old characters" who had been displaced for example "Old Joe" and "Aunt Carrie who ran a sweetshop from her front room. Although relatively recent, the piece firms up knowledge which would probably have otherwise been lost. Ironically, it will be placed in the 'Lawrence Maker Newspaper Archive', so in many ways it has come home.

On a completely different tack, I am glad to report that whilst driving out to Kelly Bray along Launceston Road, I passed Venning's Fountain and lo and behold the water supply has been restored to this now fairly ancient monument. One can only assume, that the flow was interrupted by the works being carried out in the Quarry at the rear. This for me has fond memories back to boyhood when we used to stop to quench our thirsts from the crystal clear water that poured from the spout (you could happily do that back then without fear of pollution). Latest acquisitions (not handled by me), I am informed that we have been the recipients of two Notice Boards kindly donated by Mr Campbell of the former Rugby Club (now sadly defunct), to take care of for those future generations that might be interested. They will make an interesting static display.

This bulletin has been done in some haste so my apologies for its short format. However, do make it your resolution to come out to The Chapel in Liskeard Rd at the entrance to the Cemetery where you will receive a warm welcome and learn about the town and glorious surrounding countryside.

## Liskeard Road Roundabout Project – A year on



Last year Callington Lions Club was looking for a community project to get actively involved with. As you enter Callington from Liskeard, the first sighting was of a very overgrown garden area, adjacent to the roundabout, that had been left unattended for many years; it really needed some attention. It was also the site, since 2000, of a Lions Club of Callington Millennium Stone.



The idea was met with great enthusiasm and willing Lions started to cut into the six foot high brambles that totally covered the area along with many overgrown grasses. Several trailer loads were removed and the garden began to clear. The path through the garden changed from a narrow overgrown area to a wide open pathway. The benches breathed in the fresh air and the view across to the Moors could be seen again. The team worked tirelessly over the next few weeks to clear the garden, turning over the soil and removing weeds, roots and rubbish that had been left over a period of time. Our efforts were well received by many residents, either walking their dogs or just out for a stroll and the benches were back in use to sit and admire the view. The groundwork was completed in early 2020. Sadly, during this time, we lost one of our members who had been actively involved in this project, Rosie Hanns. The Club, with agreement of her Family, will use this project as a lasting memory of Lion Rosie.

The next step was to provide a few raised flower beds. We approached Travis Perkins, Callington, who very generously donated the materials we would require. Another Lions team gathered and set about building three wooden planters.



Once completed, they were installed at the roundabout, a great addition to the now blossoming area. Grass was sown and bulbs planted over the coming months but progress was hampered by the Covid-19 pandemic. However, the back of the project had been broken and the lock down time allowed the ground to recover and once some planting had been done, the project was coming together. Some of our members were able to ensure the newly planted planters were maintained by taking a walk and watering the plants, although it was a much easier walking back with the empty water bottles and

As the trees came back into foliage it became clear that they produced a canopy over the planters so when relaxation of the guidelines allowed, two of the planters were moved to allow the flowers to bloom in the sunlight. The area is becoming well established and additional daffodil and crocus bulbs have been added along with some bluebells and primroses. Hopefully in time the spread of wild flowers will add to the colour and provide a warm welcome to Callington.

### Monthly Recipe

#### Apple and Ginger Chutney



- 4 1/2 lbs (2kg) apples, peeled and cored
- 2lbs (900g) soft brown sugar
- 1 1/2 lbs (650g) onions chopped
- 2 pints (1.1ltr) malt vinegar
- 1 1/2 lbs (650g) sultanas or raisins
- 1 inch ginger root per 1 large apple or 2 small, peeled and finely chopped
- 1 desert spoon mustard seeds
- 1 tsp mixed spice

Cut apples into small pieces, place in a large pan with the sugar, onions and vinegar, bring to boiling point, stirring regularly, simmer until pulpy. Add all the other ingredients and simmer for ten minutes or until thick. Pour into warmed very clean jars, cover with waxed paper disks, leave until cold then cover with vinegar proof lids, label and store in a cool dark place. Ready to use after 3 months.

# Lights, Camera, Action..... ..... and Callington CAVe is back!

For those of you who are new to the area, or perhaps have been unaware of our existence over the years, Callington Community Arts (known as CAVe) is a local charity-based organisation which aims to bring live entertainment and cinema to Callington.

With transport costs, bridge fees and parking costs always on the rise, our aim is to bring all kinds of entertainment to Callington at prices that suit the vast majority.

In the past we have brought theatrical drama, comedy, puppetry, light opera, classical music, jazz and rock and a huge range of other genres on a regular basis. The acts have been suitable for all ages, from primary school age children to retirees – and those in between.

We are fortunate in not having the financial pressure of filling an auditorium all the time, which allows us to choose performances which hope, will be appreciated by the townsfolk of Callington and the surrounding area.

Of course, we do hope that people will come and support us, if not only for the artists: they really do prefer performing in front of an appreciative audience rather than rows of empty seats!

Coming up in time for Christmas will be two new shows, one specifically aimed at the whole family and one with a more adult theme, but both guarantee to bring a smile back to your face after the hard times we have all suffered recently. As well as live entertainment, CAVe brings cinema to the Town Hall on the fourth Thursday of each month. Working alongside C-Fylm, we aim to offer recently produced films which have been highly acclaimed or box office successes.

People are required to become members of C-Fylm at the enormous cost of £6 per year (but you do get admission to the first film included in that price) and thereafter films cost just £4 for adults and £3 for under-18s. These are bargain prices that let you enjoy films with other people, and perhaps chat with them afterwards – and we don’t pressure you into buying buckets of popcorn!

Callington Community Arts is also the driving force behind the annual Callington MayFest. For the uninitiated, MayFest has become the biggest community event in Callington’s social calendar and involves closing the town centre to allow music, dance and theatre to take place.
