




## Callington Remembrance Service

What a fabulous turn out on Sunday 14th November to commemorate Remembrance Sunday in Callington. Following a parade through the town, representatives from the Royal British Legion, Organisations, Groups, the Armed Forces, the Emergency Services, Callington Town Council, Cornwall Council, Local Businesses, Volunteers and Town Residents together with Sheryll Murray MP and Callington Town Band gathered at St Mary's Church Cenotaph, to pay their respects.

A wonderful rendition by Barratt's Privateers of a song originally penned in Gunnislake and sung to send the soldiers off from the station in the First World War, was exceptionally moving. The names of the fallen of Callington and Kelly Bray were read followed by a 2 minute silence. Not even the noisy cry of local sea gulls could detract from the immense respect shown for those who made the ultimate sacrifice and gave their lives in WWI, WWII and all subsequent conflicts.



The Callington Poppy Volunteers' marvellous Poppy Wave was once more suspended from St Mary's Church and provided a colourful backdrop to the Wreath Laying ceremony led by the Reverend David Moss. A massive thank you to all those who have given hundreds of hours to create this lasting and



thought provoking memorial. A special thanks to the Callington branch of Cornwall Fire and Rescue for their help once again in affixing it to the Church.

A short church service was held in St Mary's Church following the wreath laying and the Callington Women's Institute provided a wonderful afternoon tea in the Town Hall.

Thanks to all those who made the day such a success and for showing how much Remembrance Sunday means to the community.

### [South Hill Bat Project – helping bats and humans share their space](#)

South Hill Bat Project was thrilled to be nominated for an award from the Bat Conservation Trust, for work with Bats in Churches. Church Warden Miranda Lawrance-Owen stated how affirming this was for the work being done with our bats.

The campaign to help local bats keep the roof over their heads, was launched in August and has had an amazing response.

Judith Ayers, Project Coordinator said: "The £6,000 target is becoming a reality with £3,700 already secured through our sponsor a bat campaign. We now have bats named Eeyore, Sampson, Daisy, Brent, Acrobat, Batman and many more. Supporters are from all around the globe, with interest as far away as Melbourne!"

There has been welcome support from well known naturalist Chris Packham. He has personally sponsored a bat and named it Botham, as he said in his Tweet "he was quite handy with a bat." His support and sharing on his social media has considerably increased the amount raised and the profile of the campaign.

St Sampson's Church, South Hill has recently received their bat mitigation licence and the urgent roof works have now begun, being sensitive to the resident bats who have finished breeding for this year. Some bat boxes have been sited to house any bats found in the roof, whilst works are being done, with an ecologist to oversee their safety.

The first bat talk has taken place with local bat expert Tony Atkinson telling the packed church all about their amazing habits. There was even a special fly by of two bats as he finished! The whole evening was bat themed with bat cakes and crocheted bats to buy and to make the evening extra special, it was announced that Tony had won an award from the Bat Conservation Trust. More talks, a bat walk and a bat box building workshop are planned for the spring.

## Callington to receive some of the fastest broadband speeds in the UK

Thanks to a brand-new full fibre network being rolled out by Wildanet (the Cornish broadband provider), Callington will soon be able to access some of the fastest and most reliable internet speeds available in the UK.

The teams are currently working in the area to install a brand-new network, capable of delivering gigabit speeds of 1,000Mbps and beyond. Cornwall still has countless communities that are suffering with poor quality internet connection, making life harder for many families and businesses in these areas and putting them at a distinct disadvantage to the rest of the UK. Wildanet is working to change this by investing £50 million to build a brand-new digital network to connect many areas of the County that are still without access to fast, reliable internet access and creating many new jobs in the process.

### Jerome the Gnome's Seasonal Gardening Tips

Seasons Greetings my woolly wrapped pals. I'm definitely feeling a change in the temperature. A few jobs to do in December and January as follows: Make sure you harvest

the last of your root vegetables before the frosts arrive. No one likes a frozen carrot; not even the pesky Ninja rabbits that help themselves! Keep feeding the hungry birds as their food sources become more scarce in the winter. If you are lucky enough to have a pond, make sure you regularly remove any dead leaves from the water. ## Monthly Recipe

### Easy-peasy fruitcake

#### Ingredients

- 4 tbsp rum or brandy
- 1 orange, zested and juiced
- 600g mixed dried fruit (sultanas, raisins, apricots, cherries, cranberries)
- 200g butter, very soft
- 200g golden caster sugar
- 4 eggs
- 50g ground almonds
- 200g plain flour
- 100g pecan nuts or whole skinned almonds, chopped
- 100g candied peel, chopped
- 75g crystallised or candied ginger, chopped
- For the decoration apricot jam (warmed and sieved) or apricot glaze candied pineapple, candied angelica, glacé cherries (a mixture of red, green and yellow if you can find them), crystallised ginger

#### Method

##### STEP 1

Put the rum (or brandy), orange zest and juice and mixed dried fruit in a bowl and stir. Leave to soak overnight.

##### STEP 2

Heat oven to 170C/150C fan/gas 3½. Double line a 20cm tin with baking parchment. Beat the butter and sugar together until light and fluffy. Whisk in the eggs one by one, then fold in the almonds and flour. Add a pinch of salt and fold in the soaked fruit mixture (and any remaining liquid in the bowl), along with the nuts, candied peel and ginger. Spoon the mixture into the tin and level the surface.

##### STEP 3


Bake for 1 hr, then turn the oven down to 150C/130C fan/gas 2 and bake for a further 2 hrs. Check the cake to see if it's pulling away from the sides of the tin and feels firm on top. If you need to, keep cooking for a further 15 mins. Cool in the tin. If storing in the tin, wrap the cake tightly first. Will freeze for up to two months.

##### STEP 4

To decorate, brush the cake with the apricot jam (or glaze) and arrange your choice of candied fruit on top. Will keep in a sealed container for up to three weeks.



### 'NOMADLAND'

Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> January at 7:30pm - Callington Town Hall

**Nomadland** is a 2020 American drama film written for the screen, produced, edited and directed by Chloé Zhao. Based on the 2017 non-fiction book *Nomadland: Surviving America in the Twenty-First Century* by Jessica Bruder, the film stars Frances McDormand (who is also a producer on the film) as a van-dwelling working nomad who leaves her home after her husband dies and the sole industry in her town closes down, to be "houseless" and travel around the United States. A number of real-life nomads

appear as fictionalized versions of themselves.

*Nomadland* premiered on September 11th, 2020, at the Venice Film Festival, where it won the Golden Lion. It also won the People's Choice Award at the Toronto International Film Festival.

The film was a box office success, grossing \$39 million worldwide against its \$5 million budget and received widespread critical acclaim for its direction, editing, screenplay and cinematography, as well as McDormand's performance.

At the 93rd Academy Awards, it won Best Picture, Best Director, and Best Actress for McDormand from a total of six nominations; Zhao became the first Asian woman and only the second woman ever to win Best Director, while McDormand became the first woman and fourth person ever to win Academy Awards for both acting and producing, as well as becoming the first person ever to win Academy Awards as both producer and performer for the *same* film. It also won Best Motion Picture – Drama and Best Director at the 78th Golden Globe Awards, and four awards including Best Film at the 74th British Academy Film Awards.

## Introducing the Callington Town Team



The Council led Town Team was formed earlier this year in order to bid for funds being made available by Central Government and Cornwall Council. The aim of the Callington Town Team is to provide co-ordination of development activity within the town; and in doing so help to improve the economic, social and environmental revitalisation of the Town, thus making Callington a better place to live, work and visit.

The team has had two proposals approved by the Town Centre Vitality Fund (Cornwall Council) and the Welcome Back Fund (Cornwall Development Company) respectively. The Vitality Fund is supporting a project implemented through the University of Plymouth and project managed by Marcin Roszkowski (Director of Design at One Polygon) and Samantha Jackman (Director at Boost Innovations Ltd). The project will start in January 2022 and will deliver an investigation into how the Town Centre can be improved, based on the views of residents, businesses and visitors (User-Centred High Street Design). The findings will be reported to the Town Team to be disseminated to the Town Council, business owners and residents, for the Council to consider and implement the next steps.

The Welcome Back Funding (from the European regional Development Fund and Cornwall Council), will provide for ten new all-weather gazebos for use in community events and the Town Markets. It will also support the refurbishment of the Farrier's Shop Mural at the lower end of Church Street, which is currently in a very poor condition.

The Town Team will be pursuing new funding opportunities in the New Year; and this will include an exploratory venture with Duchy College (Stoke Climsland and Bicton) and other partners, to create a new Agri-Tech Innovation Centre based at Duchy College.

The Town Team is Council led but includes members from the community and business sectors. The Current members are Councillor Mike Tagg (Portreeve & Vice Chairman), Councillor Karen Gold, Mr Derek Prickett (Callington Lions Club), Mr Rick Lumley (Callington Rotary Club), Mr Jeremy Gist (Gist Insurance Brokers), Ms Hilary Mackay (Beech Auctions), Mr Steve Pridham (Callington Town Forum) & Mrs Jane Hagan-Horan (Calli Pizza Café).
