

### Jerome the Gnome's Seasonal Gardening Tips

A big welcome to March! A wonderful time in the garden when new life starts to get a wiggle on. Unfortunately, this includes the weeds. If you can

keep them under control from the start with weeding and mulching, life is a lot easier; unless you are aiming for a bumper crop of dandelions this year! The downside of new shoots is the increase in slugs and snails making short work of everything. There are lots of environmentally friendly ways you can keep them under control. Why not try beer traps? Bury waterproof containers at ground level and top up with beer. The sweet smell attracts them and although they do drown, there are worse ways to go. Sometimes, if I am in a 'hunter/gather' mode, I sneak out at night with a torch and catch them in the act. Don't bother throwing them into your neighbour's plot though, as scientific studies have shown they have a homing instinct and will only come back to yours! When they do they will probably be extra hungry after the trip and eat even more! ## Monthly Recipe



### Adaptable bean soup

#### Ingredients

2 onions

2 carrots

2 tbsp. olive oil, plus extra for drizzling

3-4 ripe tomatoes

1 bay leaf

a few large handfuls of pre-cooked cannellini beans

vegetable stock

a few slices of orange peel

1 parmesan rind, or vegetarian alternative, optional

salt and freshly ground black pepper

1 handful chard stalks (and leaves if young)

fresh parsley, chopped

French stick, to serve

#### Method

Roughly chop the onions and carrots. Warm a little olive oil in a large pan on a low heat and add the onions and carrots. Chop the tomatoes and add them to the pan with a bay leaf. Add the cannellini beans, followed by the vegetable stock - enough to cover. I like to add a couple of bits of orange peel at this stage, followed by the parmesan rind.

Season generously with salt and freshly ground black pepper and let the soup bubble. Chop the chard stalks and add to the liquid. (You could use any other greens you like.) Add plenty of chopped parsley, then add the chard leaves. Serve with some toasted French stick or ciabatta and a drizzle of olive oil.

## Callington Neighbourhood Policing Team

Callington Neighbourhood Policing Team consists of PC Franklin, PCSO Addems and Tri Service Officer Henwood. We have been approached to write a small article for the Callington Newsletter, and we thank you for this opportunity. Our combined service in Policing is 30 years plus.

Your Local Neighbourhood Policing Team are primarily involved in ensuring the most vulnerable people in the community are safeguarded from harm, resolving neighbour disputes, tackling anti-social behaviour, repeat victims of crime and educating groups to better stay safe. This often requires partnership working with other professional agencies including housing providers, health representatives and Social Services.

Our current priorities are dealing with anti-social behaviour and drug misuse. On the Devon and Cornwall website [www.devon-cornwall.police.uk](http://www.devon-cornwall.police.uk) you can contact your local neighbourhood team, ask NED. You can find out how many calls are outstanding on the 101 number, complete an online crime report, utilise our webchat function or email 101 (which has the same outcome as calling 101).

We get asked "How can I contact the Police if I can't get to a Police station or have no credit on my mobile or wifi?"

Callington still has its 101 telephone Police Blue phone which is located by the BT telephone box in New Road, Callington on the outside of the Town Hall. You can also follow your local neighbourhood Team on social media sites such as Facebook and Twitter by searching Callington Police.


