The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Special

Elizabeth II acceded to the throne at the age of 25 upon the death of her father, George VI, on 6 February 1952. The Coronation was held more than one year later because of the tradition of allowing an appropriate length of time to pass after a monarch dies. Tuesday 2nd June 1953 saw the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in Westminster Abbey. It has been the only British coronation to be fully televised as television cameras had not been permitted inside the abbey during her parents' Coronation in 1937. Millions across Britain watched the event live on the BBC with many purchasing or renting television sets especially for the occasion. It is recorded that an average of 17 people gathered around each tiny 12.5" screen; a far cry from today's wide screen capabilities! Although the BBC filmed the entire event in black and white, colour films were also made and even experimental 3D technology was trialled.

Norman Hartnell was commissioned to design outfits for all the Royal Family including the Queen's, a white silk dress embroidered with floral emblems of the countries of the Commonwealth at the time: the Tudor rose of England, Scottish thistle, Welsh leek, shamrock for Northern Ireland, wattle of Australia, maple leaf of Canada, the New Zealand silver fern, South Africa's protea, two lotus flowers for India and Ceylon, and Pakistan's wheat, cotton and jute.

It was estimated to have cost £1.57 million which would equate to approximately £41,710,000 today. The costs included provision of stands along the procession route to accommodate 96,000 people, toilets, street decorations, outfits, car hire, repairs to the state coach and alterations to the Queen's regalia. The celebration weekend in 2022 runs from Thursday 2nd—Sunday 5th June and whilst it certainly won't cost the residents of Callington, Kelly Bray and the surrounding parishes anything like that, a huge number of volunteers, local organisations and the Town Council have arranged an amazing number of events for everyone to enjoy. Reading recent posts on social media, it is apparent there is a lot of concern from Patients about various issues. Having summarised the concerns and questions and presented them to the Practice staff at Callington and Gunnislake the following is intended to try to answer some of the questions and also provides some exciting news about dispensing medication.

Can we reduce the time between ordering and collection medication? *Not currently – sickness absence and county-wide difficulties in recruiting new staff have meant being unable to return to a 3-day collection time. Our team are working tirelessly to try and keep as up to date as they can. In the year April 21 to 22 we lost 1,408 dispensing hours (37.5 weeks of full-time hours). COVID has caused huge pressure on staff absence and many other knock-on issues. The team have been prepared to put in 1874 hours of overtime in the last year alone to ensure that the Dispensary/Pharmacy has remained open.*

It is not always apparent if the appointment is at Callington or Gunnislake. *We have reminded reception to confirm these details but please ask if you are unsure.*

You only need to make a verbal request to access patient records. Is this true? *Yes, that is correct, a verbal request is sufficient for a request for information, but reception staff are directed to fill in a form (that the patient would receive if making the request in writing), so we have a record of the request being made. We do like the patient to complete the form themselves so that no errors are made, or information missed that was expected.*

Can we return to being able to make advance appointments? *All Nursing appointments were always available in advance and still are. Extended hours appointments with GPs are available on Saturdays now (soon to incl. evenings), telephone appointments with GPs, medication review appointments with our Pharmacists, Social Prescriber, Mental Health Practitioner, First Contact Physiotherapist, and acute type appointments with our Nurse Practitioner/Paramedics are all available in advance in the Practice. Patients can use eConsult to consult with a clinician electronically at a convenient time for them, receiving a response back by the end of the next working day. There is also the option to book a video consultation, in advance or on the day, with an NHS doctor via the LIVI service.*

Can we take prescriptions to a chemist and not to the surgery? *Yes, patients can choose to not be dispensing but would need to come and collect their signed prescription if it can not be sent electronically to the Pharmacy of choice.*

Are we going to return to calling the surgery to book an appointment as opposed to waiting for a call back? *As we are slowly getting back to pre-pandemic routines, we should be able to go back to pre-booking the appointments not mentioned previously. However, appointments on the day were always triaged unless they could be booked with another type of clinician.*

When are annual medication reviews going to start? *We restarted this last autumn; we are still a little bit behind but aim to catch up over the coming months.*

Why are patients having to wait outside at Gunnislake Practice, sometimes in bad weather and often for more than fifteen minutes? Many report that they are ignored. *The space at Gunnislake was an issue as we could not have too many people in the foyer due to infection control guidance. That has now changed so more people will be able to come in the building if they feel comfortable to do so. Due to the backlog of prescriptions, if someone arrives to collect their medication and it has not yet been made up or there is a query the staff must action the request. This can be time consuming dependent on the number of items to be dispensed or any additional information requirements. If the staff must go back and forth from their terminal to check a patient's records it is possible that others in the queue appear to be ignored. It is certainly not their intention to ignore anyone.*

The good news is that the Practice will be installing automated dispensing machines first at Callington in late May and then in Gunnislake in early Autumn.



Monthly Recipe

Summer Party Gateau

Recipe by Mary Berry
Preparation time over 2 hrs Cooking
30mins-1 hr Serves 16

Ingredients

For the Genoese sponges

8 eggs
250g/9oz caster sugar
250g/9oz self-raising flour
100g/3½oz butter, melted and cooled, plus extra for greasing

To decorate

900ml/1½ pints double cream
400g/14oz raspberries
300g/10½oz blueberries
300g/10½oz blackberries
icing sugar, for dusting

Method

1. This recipe is best started the day before you want to serve it. You will need two 23cm/9in round cake tins with 5cm/2in sides. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4, then grease the tins with butter and line the bases with baking paper.

2. To make the sponges, put four of the eggs and half the caster sugar in a bowl and, using an electric hand whisk or food mixer, whisk until thick, pale and fluffy. When you lift the whisk, the batter dropping from it should leave a trail in the mixture below.

3. Sift half the flour into the mixture, and gently fold in to combine. Drizzle half the cooled melted butter around the outside of the mixture and carefully fold in before pouring into one of the prepared cake tins.

4. To make the second sponge, simply repeat steps two and three, and pour into the second tin.

5. Bake both sponges at the same time in the oven for about 30 minutes, or until pale golden-brown, firm in the middle and shrinking away from the sides of the tin. If not baking on the same shelf, you may need to swap the tins around halfway through to ensure you get an even bake.

6. Remove from the oven and, after 10 minutes, release from the tins and set aside to cool completely on a wire rack. Remove the lining paper and, using a bread knife, slice each sponge in half horizontally to give four layers in total.

7. Whip the cream in a bowl until it forms firm peaks. Reserve 4 tablespoons for decorating the top of the cake, and then divide the remaining whipped cream into three. Divide a mixture of the three different berries into three piles, reserving a handful of each for the top of the cake.

8. Place one layer of sponge on a large plate, then spread with a third of the whipped cream, scatter over a third of the mixed berries, making sure they come around the edge of the cream, so they can be seen. Add another layer of sponge on top and repeat until you have three layers, topped with a final layer of sponge.

9. To decorate the top, spread the reserved cream in a small circle in the centre of the sponge and arrange the remaining berries on top. Cover carefully with cling film and put in the fridge to settle for a few hours, but overnight if possible. When you are ready to serve, dust the gateau with icing sugar and cut into slices.





In the beginning, there was only a faraway churchyard. The road to St. Sampson's was onerous to carry the weight of the dearly departed. "What say ye we have a church and a yarde of our own?" said the burghers of Callington in 1371. In time, the parishioners of St. Sampson's, the Lord of the Manor, the Prior of the Abbey of St. Germans, and the Pope in Rome himself all agreed...it was a long walk. So, in 1438, St. Mary's became its own daughter church to St. Sampson's and Callington Parish was created from South Hill. Now we walk this Medieval route from Callington to St. Sampson's in celebration!

Dignitaries start outside St Mary's Church, Callington 1pm. Teams of Barrow pushers assemble at Beech Auctions, South Hill Road 1.30pm. Procession starts 2pm, walks to St Sampson's Church, South Hill, where there will be food, beer tent, stalls and games. Get your teams of barrow pushers together - up to six people. Families, organisations, businesses, young and old. **Grand prize** and prizes for different categories of fancy dress and themed barrows.


