Yet another busy month for all our sections. The whole group enjoyed The Big Jubilee Lunch, participating in various Jubilee themed activities and finishing with a huge lunch. During the Jubilee weekend celebrations, four of our young members carried the group standards for the Civic Service at the recreation ground representing their sections and making us all very proud.

The Squirrels had a mini adventure in the park making huge bubble snakes using an empty bottle, a clean sock and some soapy water! They followed a basic map of the park finding pictures in various locations and even found time to make some tasty treats for the birds. During another session the Squirrels made some noise with beautifully decorated, DIY musical instruments and were able to take home their own mini drums and guitars. More recently they covered some basic first aid skills, bandaging and 999 calls, the recovery position and spotting potential dangers in the home.

The Beavers spent an evening along the river, taking in the surroundings, listening to the sounds of nature, finding animal tracks and spotting different creatures along the way. As well as filling their wellies with water in the river, they got mucky by making native seed bombs which were scattered in the Scout Hut garden to make a beautiful display and encourage pollinating insects. The Beavers used a rainy session to get active indoors, monitoring their heartbeats during various activities and exercises which included some fabulous hula-hooping skills. They have been looking at how the human body works and naming some major organs.

The Cubs had a spectacular time camping, enjoying a glorious weekend of sunshine. Despite not a lot of sleep on the first night, they went into the next morning full of enthusiasm. They pioneered ballistas, followed a large orienteering course and built shelters which kept them dry. They sang lots of songs around the campfire played a wide range of games, crafted monsters and made brilliant kites which have since been flown at Kit Hill. Monthly Recipe



Quick Sausage Bolognese

Recipe by Justine Pattison - BBC Food

Preparation time less than 30 mins
Cooking 30mins-1 hr
Serves 4

Ingredients

4–6 good-quality sausages (300–400g/10½–14oz)
1 tbsp olive oil
1 small onion, finely chopped
½–1 tsp dried chilli flakes, according to taste
400g/14oz tin chopped tomatoes
2 tbsp tomato purée
150ml/5fl oz red wine or water
½ tsp dried mixed herbs or dried oregano
275g/9¾oz dried spaghetti
grated Parmesan, to serve (optional)
fresh basil leaves, to serve (optional)

Method

1. Squeeze the sausage meat out of the skins into a large non-stick frying pan. Add the oil and onion and cook over a medium heat for 10 minutes, or until lightly browned. Use two wooden spoons to break up the sausage meat into small mince-like pieces as it cooks. Add the chilli flakes and cook for 1 minute more, stirring.

2. Add the tomatoes, tomato purée, red wine (or water) and oregano. Bring to a gentle simmer and cook for 8–10 minutes, or until the sauce has thickened, stirring regularly.

3. Fill a large saucepan with water and bring to the boil. Add the pasta to the water and cook for 7–9 minutes (or according to the pack instructions) until tender, stirring occasionally to separate the strands.

4. Drain the cooked pasta in a colander and return to the saucepan. Tip the spicy sausage sauce into the same pan and toss well together. Serve topped with grated Parmesan and scattered with torn basil leaves.

As I write this Callington is just about half way through it's Queen's Jubilee Celebrations. I have to say how lucky we are to have the personnel and organisations within the town with the ability to do justice to this singularly unique event. Last night I was one of probably 150 people who bussed, walked, took the car to the summit of Kit Hill for the lighting of the Jubilee Beacon. Down the years, I have been to many a May Day Bonfire, but this was different. We had the Town Crier declaring his presence and reading a Proclamation, a Bugler (courtesy of the Town Band), a Piper resplendent in full ceremonial attire and of course Callington's own Town Band who quite naturally had to play 'Congratulations' as part of their repertoire! At 8.45pm, together with hundreds of others across the Country and Commonwealth, the Portreeve and representatives from Stoke Climsland, Calstock, South Hill, St. Ives and St Mellion parishes stepped forward to formally carry out the lighting ceremony. No 'Bryant & Mays' to get it going, but proper torches preloaded with something inflammable and boy did it go, easily visible from miles around, which indeed was its purpose. Other beacons punctuated the night sky and surrounding horizon (we were blessed with a relatively clear and dry night). A unit from the Fire Brigade attended just in case! The occasion benefited from the provisions in the form of hot drinks and pasties, with Callington WI providing specially made Jubilee Tarts, for a donation; (ingredients included potatoes to represent Ireland, leeks for Wales, salmon for Scotland and Cheddar cheese for England). All in all a splendid effort.

This is the front end of what we do—preserving memories which the many children present will treasure well into the future, ensuring they are recorded for future generations to revisit. Why not come along and see us at Heritage Centre, Liskeard Road? View the present exhibition, research your family history, house, border. Take a look at both ancient and modern maps, geology and mine sites, photo and newspaper archive and of course our extensive reference library, not forgetting our flat screen to view Callington Station in action and Callington from the 1950's. 

This road is going to be closed for many more weeks into September.


Please use the diversions and avoid the narrow lanes, as there have been vans stuck at Bicton Bridge and walls hit at Berrio Mill and Wagmugle .
