

## News from Kelly Bray Residents Association

The July meeting of KBRA was once again well attended by members of the Town Council which, as always, meant that we could fire some fairly pithy questions at them and get direct answers - even if it was only a promise to look into matters and report back at our next meeting (which they have done without fail, so far). We do really appreciate their support and help with local issues, as well as being kept firmly in the loop with what is happening in Callington and the local area.

Matters under discussion included the provision of replacement lights for the village Christmas tree, which is kindly donated to us every year either by the Town Council or other generous benefactors. Following discussions with the head of Outside Services, we have opted to purchase the same lights as those used on the Christmas tree outside St Mary's Church in the town. They have a proven track record for reliability and individual units can be replaced when they do eventually fail. Unfortunately, they are rather more expensive than those we have purchased in previous years, however, we are applying for a grant as well as looking for local funding to help raise the money.

### Community Speedwatch:

Largely thanks to the great efforts and sheer persistence of Councillor Brenig Morgan, a team of local volunteers will shortly begin their duties under the Community Speedwatch scheme. Members will all have received full training on how to safely carry out this roadside operation, and will be monitoring motorists on all the main roads throughout the village. According to a survey carried out by KBRA some years ago, a whopping 98% of residents felt that there was a problem with speeding motorists, whether it be private cars, commercial vehicles or motorbikes. Hopefully, once the scheme is fully up and running we will begin to see a gradual reduction in the problem. ### **BOOK NOW!**

Tamar Valley health seasonal COVID & FLU vaccination appointments are now available for booking. The program starts on September 17<sup>th</sup> and will enable you to opt for your vaccination at Callington or Gunnislake health centre or at Callington Town Hall. The clinics will be running as double vaccination clinics as per government guidance. Both vaccines have been approved to be given together.

If you do not want the flu and COVID vaccinations together, you will be booked into the single vaccination clinics in mid/ late October and will need to attend twice to be vaccinated against both influenza and COVID.

To book an appointment the phone lines will be open from 10am – 12pm and 2pm – 4pm, this is to ensure the Practice is still able to take regular on the day phone calls from patients who need to see or speak to a clinician. Staff may offer to book you an appointment whilst you are on the phone discussing other matters if you are eligible. You can use the NHS app and system online applications to book an appointment reducing phone waiting times. You do need to register for these systems. The Practice will also be sending invitations via text message which will include a link to booking an appointment. You can also use the TVH website and click on RECEPTION & ENQUIRIES then “ask a receptionist a question”, send your availability and an appointment will be booked and confirmed with you.

Housebound patients are coded as such on the clinical system. Patients do not need to ring to confirm their housebound status unless they are temporarily housebound (recent operation or disability) or have recently become housebound. If you are housebound and have not heard from the Practice regarding a home visit by mid-October, please contact the surgery for further information and to check when your visit is scheduled.

## Monthly Recipe

### Traditional Cornish Cake

#### Ingredients:


3oz Butter  
5oz Plain Flour ,sieved  
3oz Sugar  
1 teaspoon Almond Essence  
1 Egg Lightly Beaten  
4 Tablespoons Raspberry Jam  
Water  
Sugar

#### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 400f/200c (160 for fan assisted oven)/gas mark 6.  
Line the base of a 7 inch round cake tin.  
Rub butter into flour, stir in sugar, add almond essence and egg and mix to a soft dough.  
Divide pastry in half and roll out to fit in base of tin (use knuckles to knead to fit snugly).  
Spread generously with jam.  
Roll out remainder of pastry and place on top of jam (again knead the edges to ensure it fits to the edges of the tin).  
Brush the top with water and then sprinkle with sugar (this will form the ice like crust).  
Finally, bake for 30 mins approx (check after 20 minutes to ensure the edges do not burn).

## Callington Town Women's Football Club.

### The Season has kicked off

By the time this Newsletter goes to press Callington Town Women will have commenced their league games for the season. After having two pre-season friendlies against higher opposition from higher leagues which proved very difficult, two further games were cancelled due to the opposition being unable to field teams. At the time of writing the women had enjoyed a 1-6 victory over Redruth Ladies, a match interrupted due to the injury of the Redruth goalkeeper requiring lengthy medical attention and subsequent hospital visit. The game also saw several players making their debuts for the Club as well as established players and some players making the step up from the Callington Colts team. With a number of senior players unavailable the result was a welcome and puts the squad in good stead for the new season.

August also brought a boost in terms of a number of new players and to the clubs finances, following the terrific sponsorship from Palladium Building Services announced in July the women's team received a generous donation of £750.00 to be used in whatever way would benefit the progression of the team.

Meanwhile pre-season training continued, building up general fitness and improving on skills and technical aspects of the game. Less was possible on actual game plays as attendance was disrupted by holidays and work commitments meaning that numbers were lower than the management would of hoped for. However the start of September has seen an increase with at one point 22 players present, the most in over 12 months and signifies that the team is now moving in the right direction. This number does include players who will not be available for games but want to keep fit, this is still of great benefit as it allows more realistic games play scenarios which can be taken forward into match days.

Unfortunately August also saw the loss of our first choice goalkeeper due to relocation further away in Cornwall, so we are looking for ideally an experienced goal keeper, but if not training will be given, for someone who wants to play regularly in goal. If this could be you please get in touch via one of the numbers below.

Home matches are played Sundays, kick off 14.00 at Ginsters Marsh, Callington Community College, Launceston Road, Callington, PL17 7DR.

Again we are open to and would welcome new players, whatever experience to join us and we also continue to look for match day volunteers for home games who can help out in the club house to prep and cook after match team food (nothing complicated) and cover the bar for hot and cold drinks. We would also like to increase the coaching staff so if you would like to be involved in womens football and have experience of coaching at any level or would like to start on the coaching journey please get in touch.

Following the sad departure of our former manager, we are now under new joint management - three of our regular stall-holders have stepped up to the plate to take over the running of the market, which is no easy task - simply trying to keep the other stall-holders in order can be a bit of a nightmare!

So, with things continuing to run smoothly, we are now in the run-up to the festive period (I'm steadfastly refusing to use the 'C' word for at least another couple of months). We are still selling a range of beautiful plants and the tables are also now groaning with fresh, locally grown, seasonal fruit and veg. The meat counter is full of locally reared tender prime cuts and joints of meat: the prospect of slow-cooked stews or sizzling bacon is enough to get the juices really flowing. Any meat orders for the festive season should be placed by the 7th December and can be collected at our last market on the 21st December. We have home-baked cakes, pies and pastries - all at incredibly reasonable prices - and these are a big favourite with customers: the trick is to get to the market early, because after about 10.30am it looks as if a plague of locusts has descended upon the Town Hall, with barely a crumb left. We are always on the look-out for new cooks and bakers to join our hard-pressed team, who really do struggle to keep up with demand. If you are interested in supplying the market, please do come in one Wednesday morning and have a chat.

Our wonderful team of crafters continues to produce some stunning and unique pieces, and we are so lucky to have amongst us some real 'artists' in their own particular field. From glorious glassware to simply beautiful slate creations, unique jewellery to fabulous fabrics in the form of quilts, aprons, peg-bags and some really innovative gift ideas. We also have some incredibly clever and often quirky knitted characters which please adults as much as children *but* do these lovely pieces actually get to their intended recipient or does the 'grown-up' decide to hang on to them? We have hand-made soaps containing the finest ingredients, and then we have a stall that specialises in recycling and repurposing bottles and jam jars - any empty (unless it happens to be a bottle of wine, naturally) contributions gratefully received - as well as unique resin pieces such as coasters and bookmarks.

We also have a wide variety of beautiful and unique special occasion and blank message cards: the message cards in particular are a great alternative if you don't particularly like the tinselly, sometimes rather saccharin options available from larger outlets to send during the festive season. What could be nicer than a photograph of a bright-eyed robin on a frosted bough, or a view of St. Mary's Church in the snow?

In short, it's far easier if you come in to have a look at what Callington's own Country Market has to offer! We are all only too aware of the cost of living crisis and the fact that everyone's budgets are going to be squeezed for quite some time to come. All of us stall-holders continue to make every effort to keep our prices as low as possible, in spite of the increased cost of production and raw materials. We are here to offer an alternative to shopping in supermarkets and larger stores: we offer a personal service to our customers, whether it is by taking on special commissions or simply remembering your name, and even creating items which we know might appeal to you - yes, we *really* do that! I can think of several crafters who are inspired by their own customers preferences to produce things which might be of interest (guilty as charged!).





## Callington Community College

*Congratulations to Callington Community College's students who have received their GCSE and BTEC results.*



We are delighted to announce that our results demonstrate continued improvements at Callington Community College, with another increase on last year's results – This represents three successive years of improvements and we are particularly pleased with this trend, given that these are the first formal examinations in three years and there was a predicted downwards trend for outcomes nationally. To achieve better results than the year before is always especially pleasing, but to do so, following two years of teacher assessed grades and no examination grade boundaries is truly wonderful. I am really, really proud of all of our students and our staff too. For staff, their tireless work on curriculum and delivery has really paid off and for students, whose work ethic and resilience is always humbling, these results are a real testament to their talent and productivity. It's a day full of smiles for us at Callington!

Our Maths and English results are particularly pleasing and for those students attaining strong outcomes (a grade 5 and above) the results show a further percentage increase on last year's outcomes and compared to the last validated formal examination outcomes of 2019, a terrific 16% increase.

Receiving these results means that we are ensuring greater securities for our students in the future and they will be strong competitors for university applications, apprenticeship applications and employment. More students achieving a minimum of Grade 4 in Maths and English is even more important now, with the new ruling around needing a grade 4 in English and Maths in order to access a student loan to attend university. For many students, the lack of finance would be prohibitive in them applying to university in the future. Our wonderful results enable our students to continue to access level 3 courses in the future.

In addition to English and Maths, there are also really strong outcomes in the Sciences, History, Art and Design, Photography, Hospitality, Health and Social Care, Music and Spanish.

There are lots of student successes to celebrate with a number of students achieving the top grades of 8 and 9, equivalent to the old A\* grades. These include;

Joe Bell who secured 9s in Geography, English Language, English Literature and 8s in Maths and the Sciences.

Liam Carmichael secured a grade 9 in Physics and 8s in the other Sciences, Maths and Geography.

Darcy Easton Evans secured 9 in English Language, 8 in Maths and 7s in Sciences.

Nell McCaffrey secured 9s in art, English Literature and History, with an 8 in English Language.

Daisy Minns secured 9s in Biology and Chemistry and grade 8 in Maths, Physics and History.

Ana Pascoe secured 9s in Art and History with grade 8s and 7s in her other subjects.

Romy Richardson secured 9s in Media and Spanish, with grade 8 in Maths, Drama, History and English.

Olivia Yorke Dunne secured 9s in Art and Photography.

Jodie Dymond secured a 9 in Media and grade 7 in English Literature and History.

## **CURRENT PROJECTS - Since 1985, Rotary's key humanitarian priority has been to rid the world of polio.**

### **What is end polio now?**

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years, and we've made incredible progress in the fight to rid the world of it forever. As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've helped to reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent. Rotary spearheaded the campaign at a time when there were over 1,000 polio cases a day in 125 countries, paralysing and even killing children.

There are now just two countries where polio is endemic but, scarily, there have recently been found traces in London sewerage. Here is still work to be done.

Because of the efforts of Rotary and our partners, nearly 19 million people who would otherwise have been paralysed are walking, and more than 1.5 million people are alive who would otherwise have died. Continued campaigning, health worker training and vaccination programmes are essential to stop the disease returning and ensuring the world is certified polio-free.



## **UKRAINE**

### **"The hero village that stopped the Russian advance on Kyiv but was destroyed in the process"**

Moshchun village, northwest of Kyiv, saw heavy fighting in the early days of the Russian aggression with around 80% of the village destroyed. Lives were lost, homes were destroyed and hearts and minds broken. Many of the villagers want to go back home but have nothing to return to.



Rotary GB&I Ukraine Crisis Taskforce are working closely with a Rotary District in Ukraine and together have identified this as a priority project. The aim is to start rebuilding the village before the first snows arrive in October. Callington Rotary is donating financial assistance toward this scheme to help purchase and install 300 modular homes for families.

### **AMBULANCE AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES**

Callington Rotary is also working actively on a project to supply an ambulance with essential products to ease the situation in Ukraine. The ambulance has already been secured and we are looking to source items to fill the vehicle. ### **SHELTER FOR DISPLACED PERSONS**

While the Moshchun project is helping Ukrainians to return to their villages, there are many, many more who are homeless and urgently need temporary accommodation. To this end Callington Rotary is joining with clubs across the Southwest peninsula to contribute towards shelter for displaced persons in Ukraine.

## First Apprentice Kick-Starts Career in Quarter of a Million Pounds Training Project

Today [Wednesday 7 September], the first trainee of the Tamara Landscape Partnership Scheme's quarter of a million pounds training project, starts as an Assistant Ranger Apprentice.

23-year-old Myles Pinkney is the first of 20 apprentice, foundation and internship trainees who will work in the Tamar Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, which is an historically important and protected landscape bordering Devon and Cornwall.

The £268k 'Tamara Trainees' project is part of the Tamara Landscape Partnership Scheme, which is funded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund and other partners to create a brighter future for the Tamar Valley and its communities. The total to be invested across the Tamar Valley until 2025 will be £3.2 million.

### **Chris Harris, Tamara Trainees Project Officer explains:**

*"The Tamar Valley is a remarkable place. This project will train local people so they have the right skills needed to work in this historic and protected landscape whilst also supporting the small unique businesses that operate here."*

The first Tamara Trainees role is a National Trust Assistant Ranger Apprenticeship, which has been jointly funded in partnership with the National Trust and will last 18 months. It is hoped that over five apprenticeships will be made available as Tamara Trainees over the next three years, three of which will be with the National Trust.

### **Stuart McLeod, Director, London & South at The National Lottery Heritage Fund says:**

*"We are delighted to be supporting the Tamara Landscape Partnership to not only give people the opportunity to learn about heritage, but to become truly involved in it through the Tamara Trainees element of their project. We know that giving people a chance to have a closer understanding and relationship to their heritage reaps many benefits and is something we are proud to fund."*

### **Myles Pinkney, National Trust Assistant Warden Apprentice says:**

*"It is great to have started working at Cotehele and I am looking forward to exploring the woodlands and various other habitats to learn how to manage and protect this special historic and environmentally rich place."*

Myles will work to protect and improve the health and wildlife richness of the National Trust's Cotehele Estate. He grew up and went to school in the local area and he knows the Tamar Valley well. Keen to enter the conservation sector, he unsuccessfully applied for similar roles around the country. However, the Tamara Trainees Project will give him the opportunity to stay close to home and study in a place he knows and loves.
