



Despite difficulties, Lions assist with another Mission delivering more aid to Ukraine

Although conditions were difficult Callington Lions have assisted again the Charity 'Sending Love to Ukraine' in delivering humanitarian aid.

At 3.00 am on the 3rd February, Lions Andrew and Emma Burnard set off in the dark on the five day, 2,500mile round trip to Poland. There were ten vans, making up this, the nineth convoy, each loaded with much needed items destined for Ukraine. As they drove further East towards Warsaw, road conditions became difficult with ice and much snow.

The requested essential supplies filled a warehouse. It included wheelchairs, generators, first aid kits, warm winter clothes, nappies and much, much more. Urgently needed items were immediately loaded onto other vehicles for the onward journey to hospitals near the front in Ukraine.

Emma added that the amount collected was due to the generosity of the people from all over Cornwall and Devon and further afield. Andy said it was good to be joined by fellow Lions from Tavistock and Weymouth and Launceston's Unique Mobility for this trip.



After unloading and sharing a meal with Polish Lions, Ukrainians, and others, the twenty strong team started off back again in the dark on the snowy return trip. They were able to bring back Ukrainian refugees which included a complete family, and an elderly gentleman who had lost his wife in a missile attack. The refugees had been sponsored by English families.

Sending Love to Ukraine's leader and fellow Lion Darren Tait said that this was one of the more difficult trips with the weather conditions not helping. He added that another trip is planned for the 9th March.

Who are your Councillors?






Rosemaria (Maria) Coakley



Although currently closed, the Heritage Centre has not been idle. Our thanks go to Roy and Elaine who together delivered a slide show and talk to the good folk of Age Concern using many of our archival photographs. These were probably part of our vast collection donated by the Gimblett family of Callington covering many decades (we were indeed fortunate to have them in the town) - their fish and chips were'nt bad either! Talking of which, many a Friday/Saturday night my Mum and I would stop in there, prior to our long walk out to Kelly Bray and after seeing the latest film in the Town Hall presented by Mr Hicks the projectionist and policed by Miss Strutt! Ah! the memories. Well I've still got one, so I guess I can be grateful

there. Further thanks to, I believe, a relative of the Penney family who has kindly donated a Testimonial presented by Launceston Town Council to Councillor Penney for 25 years service and various other items relating to the family. These include a book of the Methodist Callington Circuit dated 1901 (with bulletins for each Chapel and their Ministers) with photos of Lucket tMethodist Chapel in particular. Interestingly, a large black and white photo of Stoke Climsland Home Guard during WWII was also included. As Stoke has a fairly active family history group I would imagine they could identify many of



those in uniform, it would be good if they could get in touch. We continue to collate items of interest and photos of individual Musicians, Choirs and Bands who have graced the local Town Halls and Dance floors through the years. Callington had their fair share and the stages at the Town Hall and The Blue Cap Hotel have accommodated many of them, when the Friday/Saturday Night Dance was the go to event. We have a wonderfully atmospheric black and white photo of a formal (probably dinner dance or Hunt Ball) in the Blue Cap with the men in their evening dress and the ladies elegantly turned out 1920s/30s I should think. Many think back on those times with nostalgia because after the Jazz Age and Rock 'n' Roll these musicians and their bands just faded away-a few survive and what a joy it is to enjoy live music when you can. So once again, it would be good if any of our interested Callingtonians could search their lofts / photo albums for any family members who were musicians or where members of choirs or bands-we are available to take items in every Friday after 12noon or if you give me a ring I can call and collect. CHANGES ARE UNDER WAY FOR HONEY FAIR!

Honey Fair Day will now be Saturday 30th September

Callington and District Lions are introducing changes to Honey Fair to make it a more family friendly event.

Honey Fair was first established over 750 years ago when Henry III granted Callington a market-day on the first Wednesday in October. This was for local beekeepers to sell their honey. Following a lapse in Honey Fair Day during the Second World War, it was reinstated in 1978 by John Trevithick and then a year later Lions took over the running of the event and have been organising it ever since.

Callington Lions agreed that after 45 years, the covid period and last year's lower public response, it was time for a change.

Holding Honey Fair day on the first Wednesday of October restricted schools, youngsters. workers and families being able to attend.





Following discussions with many, it was concluded that it could be made more family friendly by holding the Fair on a Saturday. This would allow many more to enjoy the stalls, animals, street performers and all that Honey Fair can offer.

Lions would still retain the traditional events of Town Crier competition, music, school art competition, shop art and much more.

In the meantime, Callington Lions are busy helping those in need such as Ukraine and to make donations to Callington Foodbank, Plymouth Soup Run and other such good causes.
