What followed I am pretty vague about, although being gifted a Coronation Mug comes to mind, as did a party later at the WI Hall Kelly Bray with Pearce's "tuffs" and jam and cream!!

Here at the Heritage Centre for this season, we are putting on display some of our rather sparse collection of Charles memorabilia. However, it is all original material from the 50s as carried by "Picture Post" (the "Hello" Mag of its day) featuring a six year old Charles and later some of his Investiture as Prince of Wales. I might be wrong but the only time I can recall the Prince visiting Callington was in June 2006 for the occasion of the opening of The Disabled Access Project at Callington Bowling Club. The visit with photos is recorded in a recently published book "A concise History of Callington Bowling Club" now on sale at the Heritage Centre.



We are utilising our new free standing display boards in the fover to exhibit



HOW TO PLANT A HANGING BASKET

Lining: First of all, if you are using a standard wire basket, it will need to be lined. You can buy readymade cardboard liners and fibrous materials sold for the purpose, but a thrifty option is to collect moss from the lawn. Avoid sphagnum moss as it may not be harvested from sustainable sources. Aim to cover the inside with about a 1.5cm (½in) thick layer of the material.



Watering systems: Before you fill your basket with compost consider how you will water it. Hanging baskets tend to dry out more quickly than other types of container and water can easily be wasted from them. Plants grow better with rain water, especially if you plan to use soluble feed so avoid using mains tap water if you can. If you have many baskets, you might consider using an automated watering system. Drip irrigation systems deliver water slowly and directly to the roots so there is less risk of wasting water. They can be used with timers but still need to be adjusted as the plants grow bigger and the weather changes. Most drip irrigation systems are designed for mains tap water use as they need very clean and pressurised water for the drippers to operate correctly and avoid blockages.

Compost: A good quality, peat-free multipurpose is fine for a display that only has to last for one year.

AFTERCARE

Watering frequency: Check baskets every day in summer, watering always unless the compost is wet. Drying out is an increasing risk as the plants grow and days remain warm or windy. An easy way to check if they need water is to gently lift or nudge the baskets to gauge how heavy they are. If they are really light weight, they need more frequent watering. Try to avoid them drying out to the point where plants start to droop ('wilting point'), but if they do wilt, you can place a bucket underneath to capture the water that runs off the surface as you water them and return it to the basket. This will also save losing soluble nutrients that are needed for flowering. Although baskets don't dry out as quickly in winter, they still need regular checking. Aim to keep the compost moist but not soggy, and avoid wetting the foliage and flowers.

Feeding: Summer bedding plants and edibles benefit from regular feeding with a liquid fertiliser in spring, summer and early autumn (April to September). Winter hanging baskets don't need feeding - it can encourage soft new growth that is easily damaged by frosts. If you grow little shrubs or perennials in your baskets, feed them annually in spring by adding a slow-release fertiliser.

Deadheading: Deadhead regularly to encourage a succession of flowers and prevent the plants' energy going into seed production.

1st Callington Scout Group



To kick-start our Summer Term, 1st Callington attended the East Cornwall District Fun Day. Despite the drizzly rain and chilliness, all of our sections soldiered on in our wet weather gear. There were so many great activities, experiences and memories made. It was a SUPER DUPER day!

Squirrels have been focusing on the wild world, learning more about animals both BIG and small. After learning about endangered animals through storytelling and games, they each got creative and made their own animal mask. They have also been brilliant builders, working as a team to create a number of fantastic, big dens in the woods. In addition to this, they have also sowed their own sunflower seed to look after and grow. Some Squirrels believe that their sunflower is going to grow taller than our Scout Hut roof, past the clouds and all the way up to the Moon...wouldn't that be amazing!

Beavers completed a number of fun team games and challenges in their lodges. They have also started their cyclist badge, learning the importance of safety equipment and the different parts of a bike. Soon, they will be going out for a short ride. For this, they will demonstrate that they can correctly put on and wear a cycle helmet like Matilda the watermelon. They have also been busy doing all things gardening. They planted a nasturtium and sunflower to care for, learned what plants need to grow, what tools you need and how to use them safely and what happens to trees in each of the four seasons.

Cubs up-cycled tin cans into funky monster flower planters. They have also been working towards their Navigator Stage 2 badge. They played a game of North, East, South, West and gradually added more points of the compass. They located themselves on a map, drew a simple map from our meeting place to a point of interest, gained understanding on how to use the key of a map, discussed what they would and would not bring on a hike and made marble mazes.

Scouts raced in their Patrols to complete a hunt around the town. Using a map, they went to each marked point and found a letter. After finding all of the letters, they returned to the Hut to decode and unscramble, making two words. They have also completed a what3words walk. At each checkpoint, they had to answer a question related to the area.
