Neighbourhood Plan - Consultation on the Draft Callington and Kelly Bray Neighbourhood Plan

Following on from the adoption of the Vision for Callington and Kelly Bray in February 2020, the Town Council, Steering Group and consultant team have been working to develop the Neighbourhood Plan. The Draft Plan is now ready for pre-submission consultation. This is also known at the Regulation 14 consultation.

We would like to hear what people think about the document. After considering the comments received and making any necessary modifications, the Neighbourhood Plan will be finalised and submitted to Cornwall Council for Independent Examination. If the Examiner finds the Plan to be satisfactory, then Cornwall Council will arrange for a referendum to take place. This will allow local people to decide whether the Neighbourhood Plan should be used to help decide planning applications in the area in the future.

Jo Taylor, Clerk to the Town Council said "The Neighbourhood Plan provides an opportunity for local people to have a say in how the area is going to shaped in the future. After a lot of hard work, the project is very close to being completed. We now need your views on the Draft Plan and to know whether you would like to see any changes made before it is submitted for independent examination".

The consultation runs from Monday 2nd October 2023 to Monday 13th November 2023. The Draft Plan and consultation documents can viewed online at https://callington-tc.gov.uk/all-news/council-news/neighbourhood-development-plan-news/neighbourhood-development-plan/. There will also be a display in the town Hall for the duration of the consultation.







Have you ever wondered what u3a stands for? It stands for the University of the Third Age anyone who is no longer in full time gainful employment can get involved. There are now over 1,000 u3a groups in the UK that are self-run by a committee and overseen by a National Office. The committee is made up of members who serve for a maximum of 3 years so members involvement is encouraged.

Members can join 'groups' in their u3a. These range from Art to Philosophy, Baking to Walking, with subjects such as Quizzes, Crime Writing, Needlework, Pub Lunches and Skittles among the 25+ groups currently running at Callington. Groups meet in members homes or hired premises where the cost is covered by members attending.

There is no study or exams. The groups are to share interests, ideas and skills and to have some fun. You also get to meet new people, make new friends and maybe improve your social life. There is a monthly meeting on the first Monday of the month in Callington Town Hall at 10am. Coffee/tea and biscuits and a chat. Any news is shared at 10.30 and then there is a guest speaker.

Living Churchyard

St Sampson's continues to discover more species growing in the Churchyard and a recent visit from lichen expert Bob Hodgson 7th August recorded over 40 varieties.

We want to add more benches in the Churchyard, so people can sit and enjoy the space. If you would like to sponsor a bench or part bench, please contact me judithayers@yahoo.co.uk. We are aiming to use benches made from recycled plastic (approx. £250) which are environmentally friendly, maintenance free and last 5 times longer than timber. Perhaps you would like a bench in memory of a loved one.

Please can I gently remind anyone putting flowers on graves, that they should not be plastic. This is because the plastic gets brittle and broken and then small pieces are scattered in the grass, making it very difficult to remove and become a hazard to wildlife. St Sampson's is proud of being an eco-church and we strive to be environmentally friendly in all that we do, whilst creating a peaceful and beautiful haven for our loved ones no longer with us, for those visiting graves and our wildlife residents. The fence on the East boundary has been replaced by the Community Payback team and they are in the process of painting the gate.

We hope to put up more bird boxes this autumn and create an information board with many of the plants and animals that have found a home in the churchyard. More on this next month.

TVH FLU AND COVID VACCINATIONS ARE AVAILABLE TO BE BOOKED NOW!

Tamar Valley health seasonal COVID & FLU vaccination appointments are now available for booking. The program starts on September 16th 2023 and enables you to opt for your vaccination at Callington or Gunnislake health centre. The clinics will be running as double vaccination clinics as per government guidance. Both vaccines have been approved to be given together.

If you do not want the flu and COVID vaccinations together, you will be booked into the single vaccination clinics in mid/ late October for COVID and will need to attend twice to be vaccinated against both influenza and COVID.

Single flus can be booked now, including private flus if patients who are not eligible want one at our Saturday clinics.

To book an appointment the phone lines will be open from 10am – 12pm and 2pm – 4pm, this is to ensure the Practice is still able to take regular on the day phone calls from patients who need to see or speak to a clinician. Staff may offer to book you an appointment whilst you are on the phone discussing other matters if you are eligible. You can use the NHS app and systmone online applications to book an appointment reducing phone waiting times. You do need to register for these systems. The Practice will also be sending invitations via text message which will include a link to booking an appointment. You can also use the TVH website and click on RECEPTION & ENQUIRIES then "ask a receptionist a question", send your availability and an appointment will be booked and confirmed with you.

Housebound patients are coded as such on the clinical system. Patients do not need to ring to confirm their housebound status unless they are temporarily housebound (recent operation or disability) or have recently become housebound. If you are housebound and have not heard from the Practice regarding a home visit by mid-October, please contact the surgery for further information and to check when your visit is scheduled.

Appointments are available every Saturday starting September 16th to and including October 28th from 08.30 to 1430.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY

- Keep clear of all flames such as candles and lit pumpkins, which could cause costumes to catch fire or cause burns
- Plan your trick or treat route beforehand. Only go to houses where you or your friends know the residents. Always go in groups. Don't go without an adult
- Be cautious about eating what people give you when out trick or treating. Check with an adult when you get home
- Be visible, stay in areas that are well lit with streetlights. Take a torch just in case
- Remember 'STOP, DROP and ROLL' if clothing catches fire. STOP where you are. Do not run. DROP to the ground. Lie down flat. ROLL over and over on the ground until flames are out
- Don't wear masks that restrict your vision. You need to see when crossing roads
- Don't enter any house when trick or treating, stay on the doorstep
- Don't knock on doors where you see a 'No trick or treat callers' sign.



Coats that are no longer needed can make a real difference to the homeless and vulnerable during Winter time. Wrap Up is a project run by Rotary Clubs working in partnership with Hands On London. Our sole aim is to provide coats, that go directly to people who struggle to keep warm during the winter months. During **October and November** we will be collecting coats to provide to those in need. Would you be willing and able to host a collection point? This year more than ever your donated coat will be needed by someone.

Frequently asked questions

Is Wrap Up a charity?

Wrap Up is a campaign run by local Rotary Clubs, in partnership with the registered charity Hands On London (1140291).

Do you collect coats all year round?

The Wrap Up Campaign only runs during October and November each year.

Where do the coats go?

Coats donated to Wrap Up are distributed via homeless shelters, refugee centres, organisations supporting the elderly, women's refuges, children's centres and other charities helping people in crisis.

Will you take duvets, sleeping bags or other clothes apart from coats?

The Wrap Up project is being powered exclusively by volunteers through Rotary Clubs, we do not have the operational capacity or connections to accept anything other than coats.

Can you guarantee donations really do go to someone who needs it?

We work with many of our charities and beneficiaries throughout the year, so can confidently confirm that they serve the UK's most vulnerable people. Should we have a surplus of coats will look for other organisations to ensure your donation reaches a vulnerable person.

Will any coats be sold on?

No. For the small percentage of coats that are donated in very poor condition, we work with various recycling organisations. These organisations offer ethical use of the recycled products.

Your campaign looks like you've spent a lot of money on it...

The Wrap Up campaign is delivered by a team of dedicated volunteers from local Rotary Clubs. We are lucky that so many wonderful organisations and individuals believe in the campaign and want to make it a success; it is their generosity that enables Wrap Up to happen. Every year, Rotarians across the country give up their own personal time to help vulnerable individuals by making Wrap Up happen.

There are homeless people on the streets – why don't you just take the coats directly to them?

We have worked very closely with our charities and their advice is to distribute the coats we collect through them rather than directly. This is to ensure that the coats reach those most in need. People who receive the coats are encouraged to collect them from shelters, centres etc. Whilst there, they are able to access other services that can help them rebuild their lives.

Every coat counts in our quest to provide warmth to the homeless and vulnerable!

PUMPKIN PIE RECIPE

Ingredients

- 750g/1lb 10oz pumpkin or butternut squash. peeled, deseeded and cut into chunks
- 350g sweet shortcrust pastry
- plain flour, for dusting
- 140g caster sugar
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp fresh nutmeg, grated

- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 175ml milk

Method

- Place the pumpkin in a large saucepan, cover with water and bring to the boil. Cover with a lid and simmer for 15 mins or until tender. Drain pumpkin; let cool.
- Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Roll out the pastry on a lightly 2. floured surface and use it to line a 22cm loose-bottomed tart tin. Chill for 15 mins. Line the pastry with baking parchment and baking beans, then bake for 15 mins. Remove the beans and paper, and cook for a further 10 mins until the base is pale golden and biscuity. Remove from the oven and allow to cool slightly.
- Increase oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Push the 3. cooled pumpkin through a sieve into a large bowl. In a separate bowl, combine the sugar, salt, nutmeg and half the cinnamon. Mix in the beaten eggs, melted butter and milk, then add to the pumpkin purée and stir to combine. Pour into the tart shell and


cook for 10 mins, then reduce the temperature to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Continue to bake for 35-40 mins until the filling has just set.

Leave to cool, then remove the pie from the tin. 4. Mix the remaining cinnamon with the icing sugar and dust over the pie. Serve chilled.


